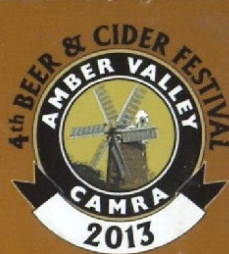

Chairman's Welcome

Welcome to the 4th Amber Valley CAMRA Beer & Cider Festival at Alfreton Leisure Centre. The move from Midland Railway at Butterley really was inevitable, not just to escape from a muddy field but more importantly to be able to increase the capacity; there should be no problem admitting everyone who wants to attend on Friday and Saturday evenings. I would like to thank our hosts at MRB for the last three years for the use of their site; I'd also like to thank our current hosts for their co-operation and encouragement during the planning stage of this festival.

CAMRA are basically about two things, breweries and pubs. On the brewery front the situation is pretty healthy at the moment; we are still seeing an unprecedented number of new breweries and, apart from a few unwelcome takeovers, few breweries closing. Overall the choice and quality available to the beer drinker is probably better than it has ever been. Whilst you are the final judge, we hope that this festival has struck a good balance between different styles, newish breweries v longer established ones and local v breweries from further afield.

Unfortunately, on the pubs front things are far from rosy. Up and down the country pubs are closing every week. This is partly due to lifestyle changes, greedy pubcos, expensive and sometimes poor quality beer, but you can make a difference too. CAMRA are constantly campaigning against pub closures and will continue to do so, but in the end a pub which isn't economically viable will close, and that is where you, the customer, come in. Of course your leisure time and your cash are precious and how you spend them is up to you. However, when you next think "Shall I go to the Local?", just reflect that for now you at least do have a choice. Without an adequate number of customers your local will close for good and then you will no longer have that choice. There is no more clearcut example of "Use it or lose it".

You may have come to this festival for various reasons; beer, cider, entertainment or a combination of all three. Whatever the reason you also get to meet people and talk face to face; this is increasingly important in the current

age of electronic communication. But what applies to festivals also applies to pubs; this festival only runs once a year while your local is open every day. There is more to going to a pub than just having a drink.

Finally I would like to thank all our sponsors but particularly our main sponsor, the Black Bulls Head, Openwoodgate for their generous sponsorship of the Festival Glasses, Chris Burrows at Wade Printers for the use of their printing facilities and Amber Ales for the t-shirts. I would also like to thank all the volunteers who have staffed this event, including the set-up and take-down, and finally the Festival Committee, without whose hard work and dedication this festival would not be taking place.

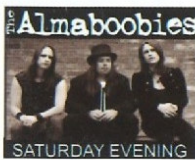
The Rollin' Stoned

With the 100 beers on offer we aim to bring you a wide variety of quality beers as in previous years. With styles ranging from pale hoppy session beers, to malty traditional bitters, a dark wheat plum beer and even a crazy collaboration IPA which has no bittering hops and is entirely dry hopped!

This year there are two new breweries represented in the form of White Dog and Shiny. There are also new beers from Muirhouse, Oakham, Abbeydale, Blue Monkey, Marble and Buxton and two one-offs from Amber Ales. Of particular note this year are three festival specials from quality local breweries, Falstaff, North Star and Shiny. These are brewed to mark the 5th anniversary since the formation of Amber Valley CAMRA, more on that below.

There is something for everyone whatever your taste or preference so please enjoy the beers.

AMBER VALLEY CAMRA

The first Meeting of Amber Valley CAMRA was held at the George, Ripley on September 18th 2008, with 41 people in attendance, 26 of whom were from Amber Valley. The Branch is therefore only a few days short of celebrating its 5th birthday. However, we remained a sub-branch of Derby CAMRA until November 2012 when, at the AGM

held at the Hunter's Arms, Kilburn, members voted unanimously to seek independence, which was ratified by CAMRA HQ soon afterwards. These three beers have been specially brewed with the history of Amber Valley CAMRA in mind.

NORTH STAR PIONEER'S PORTER

This 5% ABV Porter has been brewed to honour the 26 members from Amber Valley who turned up for that very first Branch Meeting. Without their initial interest the Branch may never have got off the ground.

FALSTAFF 5th BIRTHDAY BEST BITTER

This 5% ABV Best Bitter has been brewed to celebrate Amber Valley CAMRA's 5th birthday. We invite everyone to join in the celebrations by sampling it!

SHINY INDEPENDENCE ALE

This 5% ABV IPA has been brewed to celebrate Amber Valley CAMRA becoming an independent Branch in December 2012, just over 4 years since our formation as a Sub-Branch of Derby CAMRA.

ABBEYDALE Sheffield

Beeale ze bub 6.0% IPA
Pale honey beer. Delicate, fragrant honey flavours complemented by some citrus from the hops. Dry finish.
Absolution 5.3% Strong
Aromas of tropical fruit & mangoes. Fruity flavours with toffee apples & bananas balanced by some bitterness at the finish.

ACORN Barnsley

Gorlovka Imperial Stout 6.0% Stout
Deep malt & hoppy aroma with liquorice throughout. Roast malt, fruit & hops also carry through this full bodied stout.
Old Moor Porter 4.4% Porter
Full bodied Victorian style porter with hints of liquorice. Initial bitterness gives way to a smooth, mellow finish.

AMBER ALES Ripley, Derbyshire

Chilli 6 4.0% Pale
Pale ale infused with chilli, chilli spice aroma with a warming finish
Barnes Wallis Dry Hopped 4.0% Bitter
One-off variation of their easy-drinking IPA-style bitter, copper-coloured for a full malt flavour. Dry hopped with Summit.
Brocks Best Bitter 4.3% Bitter
Dark golden, American hopped bitter with pronounced citrus flavours, a bitter bite & dry finish.

Imperial IPA 6.5% IPA
Traditional IPA, triple hopped with a substantial malty base & big hop profile.

AXEHOLM Luddington, Lincolnshire
Plum Dunkelweizen Wheat Beer 4.7% Wheat
Dark wheat beer, rich cereal flavours & added fruitiness from Lincolnshire plums.

BLUE BEE Sheffield
Lustin for Stout 4.8% Stout
Rich complex stout, full bodied & black in colour. Plenty of roast malt flavours.
Light Blue 3.6% Bitter
Appealing russet-brown bitter with lots of hop character.

BLUE MONKEY Giltbrook, Nottingham
Ape Ale 5.4% Strong
Complex American hopped IPA. Aromas of pine, orange & just the right level of citrusiness. A dry finish & moderate bitterness.

99 Red Baboons 4.2% Ruby
Fruity hoppiness with a dark, malty side. Complex & distinctly difficult to categorise.

B G Sips 4.0% Pale
Pale & intensely hoppy. Tropical fruit aromas, finished with a good level of thirst quenching, almost peppery bitterness.

Infinity 4.6% Pale
Easy drinking light golden beer, floral nose & lovely citrusy flavours with a nice bitterness.

Infinity + 1 5.6% Strong
Pale & wheat malts with powerful Citra hops. Massively dry hopped with Citra to give a huge punch & aroma. A definite +1.

Guerilla 4.9% Stout
Double gold medal winning, revolutionary stout. A hearty beer full of malty complexity balanced by a robust bitter bite.

Marmoset 3.6% Bitter
Pale & hoppy, with a full fruity flavour for a low ABV beer.

BOB'S BREWING Healey, West Yorkshire

White Lion 4.3% Pale
Pale, flowery, lager-style beer using American Cascade hops.

Chardonayle 5.1% Bitter
Complex, stylish strong pale ale with hints of lemongrass & fruits, aroma hops dominating the flavour.

BOTTLE BROOK Horsley, Derbyshire
Rapture IPA 5.9% IPA
Pacific IPA with pronounced hoppy aroma & a sweet malty finish.
Mellow Yellow 5.7% Strong
Hoppy, initial bite gives way to fruit & spicy notes. Deceptively easy to drink.

Jacob's Ladder 2.7% Bitter
Big, hoppy little session beer brewed in support of the Buxton Mountain Rescue Team. 10p from every pint sold will be donated.
Buxton Gold 5.2% Bitter
Refreshing Amarillo & Liberty hopped golden beer with slightly fruity notes & a citrus bite at the end. Medium bitterness.

CASTLE ROCK Nottingham
Harvest Pale 3.8% Pale
American hopped with a distinct hop flavour which leads to a crisp finish. Champion Beer of Britain 2010.

Elsie Mo 4.7% Bitter
Low colour Maris Otter malt gives it its golden hue. It has a hoppy aroma & a pleasantly crisp finish.

Screech Owl 5.5% Strong
Strong, well hopped IPA, sweet & fruity with a tangy bitterness.

Lincoln Red 4.5% Speciality
American style red ale with Eldorado hops. It has a subtle spice & sweetness & a honey aroma.

COASTAL Cornwall
Summer Wakes 4.2% Pale
Single hopped, golden beer is strikingly hoppy with a mellow back feel.

DANCING DUCK Derby
Ay Up 3.9% Pale
An eminently drinkable pale session ale. Subtle malt & floral notes with a citrus hop, rounded off with a slightly dry finish.

Nice Weather 4.1% Bitter
Copper coloured, fruity, summer ale packed full of flavour.

Great aroma & powerful upfront hoppy bitterness give way to an explosion of citrus & pine flavours.

Dominated by elaborate fruity hop notes, with a grainy background & dry finish.

Citra 4.2% Pale

A light refreshing beer with pungent grapefruit, lychee & gooseberry aromas leading to a dry, bitter finish.

Golden beer with citrus hops & fruitiness balanced by malt & a bitter base. Dry, hoppy finish with soft fruit flavours.

Scarlet Macaw 4.4% Bitter

Tart gooseberry & soft peach on the nose. Gooseberries & fruit to taste, before an intense bitterness.

20 XX 5.8% Strong

Sweet peach/tropical fruit aroma with a hint of vanilla, passion fruit, mango & tart orange peel flavour gives way to a rich balanced bitterness.

Fruit notes & elderflower on aroma. Taste of ripe red berries & citrus fruit, with a long, bitter, fruity finish.

Golden beer with powerful grapefruit/citrus aromas & flavours. An intense & satisfying bitter finish.

SIBA Supreme Champion 2012, Smooth with tropical fruit flavours bursting through. Crisp finish & refreshing dry aftertaste.

English hopped version of Grey Ghost IPA, using Pilgrim, Pioneer & Admiral hops.

Inchieta 6.0% IPA

Pale, hoppy IPA with Citra, Nelson Sauvin & Summit hops.

RAW/STEEL CITY/TRULLA/SHAKESPEARE COLLABORATION

Staveley/Sheffield/Italy/New Zealand

Four Horsemen of the Hopocalypse 6.7% IPA

IPA brewed with no bittering hops. Lots of Citra, Chinook & Summit hops used for dry hopping in both fermenter & cask.

RED SQUIRREL

Hemel Hempstead, Hertfordshire

Jack Black IPA 4.8% IPA

Brewed using 3 US hops & 2 coloured malts & featuring the hop-forward profile of an IPA with the dark colour of a porter.

Red Tail Citra 4.2% Pale

Dominant Citra-hop aroma, producing a floral, fresh style, citrusy overtones & a smooth mouth feel.

Yorkshire Pale Ale is a pale, aromatic, summer ale with delicate peachy & berry fruit flavours.

Mid bodied Pale Ale with a soft hoppy hit with a hint of citrus & tangerine.

Enigma 6.4% **Strong**

Strong amber pale ale combining sweet malt undertones with a high hit of hops. Dangerously easy to drink.

THORNBRIDGE *Bakewell, Derbyshire*

Kipling 5.2% **Strong**

Passion fruit, gooseberry & mango aroma. An initial sweetness & full body balanced by a grapefruit-like bitter finish.

Wild Swan 3.5% **Bitter**

Refreshing, white gold in colour with aromas of light bitter lemon, a hint of herbs & a subtle spiciness.

Jaipur IPA 5.9% **IPA**

Complex, citrus dominated IPA, soft & smooth yet builds to a crescendo of massive hoppiness accentuated by honey.

Hopton 4.3% **Pale**

Slightly malty aroma with a hint of lime & lemon peel. Medium bodied with biscuit character & citrus present in the mouth.

TITANIC *Stoke on Trent, Staffordshire*

Plum Porter 4.9% **Porter**

Dark strong & well rounded; the richness is balanced by the late addition of Goldings hops & natural plum flavouring.

Chocolate & Vanilla Stout 4.5% **Stout**

Genuine dry stout with a rich body & a bitter edge. Sweetness comes from Chocolate & Madagascan Vanilla.

Iceberg 4.1% **Wheat**

Refreshing wheat beer with real zest from the use of Maris Otter pale & fine wheat malts.

WELBECK ABBEY *Welbeck, Worksop, Nottinghamshire*

Henrietta Grande 4.0% **Bitter**

Variation of their delicate golden ale Henrietta with even more wonderful hop character bitterness.

Cavendish 5.0% **Blonde**

The grapefruit zing of Cascade hops balances perfectly with Maris Otter malts to make this a very quaffable beer.

Harley 4.3% **Bitter**

Lightly citrus, quaffable pale ale.

WHIM *Hartington, Derbyshire*

Arbor Light 3.6% **Bitter**

Pale, sharp & very light bitter. This has the thirst quenching properties of a lager but it falls somewhere between the two.

Flower Power 5.3% **Pale**

Initial warmth with intense citrus flavours developing. Medium bodied, with complex hop character. Dry finish & very hoppy aroma.

Hartington Bitter 4.6% **Bitter**

Fruity & light, thirst quenching session bitter with distinctive hop character. Well balanced with a dry finish & spicy floral aroma.

Wicker Man 4.5% **Bitter**

Light, refreshing pale honey beer. Smooth with malt & honey flavours. Delicate aroma & sweet from start to finish.

WHITE DOG *Ilkeston, Derbyshire*

Hop Dog 4.3% **Bitter**

Well hopped pale ale with citrus & passion fruit flavours & a subtle bitterness.

XT *Long Crendon, Buckinghamshire*

XT 1 4.2% **Blonde**

Citrus & fruity hops with English barley & some Bohemian malts to make a characterful blonde ale.

XT 5 5.5% **Bitter**

Big biscuity malt base with lots of dark fruit flavoured American hops on top & 'to go'.

Amber Valley Festival 2013

Cider & Perry Bar

Welcome to the cider and perry bar at our new venue, the Bowls Hall at Alfreton Leisure Centre. I'm afraid we can't provide trains this year, but we have got a lot more space and a solid roof, and we have increased the range on the cider bar. All the ciders and perries sold here are 'real' in the sense that they consist of nothing but fermented apple and fermented pear juice respectively. Ciders and perries flavoured with other fruit are not considered 'real' according to CAMRA's definition, so I'm sorry but you will not find them on this bar. Furthermore they are not artificially carbonated or served under gas pressure. This means that the majority of the ciders are still, although some will sparkle a little due to the residual fermentation in the casks. Because of this residual fermentation ciders and perries may be crystal clear, hazy or even cloudy but should not look like vegetable soup! The range of styles and flavours is considerable, and the bar staff will be happy to give small tastes and discuss the drinks with you provided the bar is not too busy. You will find that most real ciders and perries lie in the range 5.5% to 8% A.B.V. simply because that is what a natural fermentation of 100% fruit juice produces. Some of them don't taste their strength, so beware!

The tub labels will give you a good start when ordering. Green labels are cider and yellow labels are perry. Most ciders / perries are made from a blend of apple / pear varieties; where a single variety has been used this is on the tub label. All the ciders and perries have been tasted prior to the festival for quality control and they have been categorized as Very Dry, Dry, Medium Dry, Medium, Medium Sweet, Sweet or Very Sweet, again this is on the label. Admittedly this is a bit subjective and you may disagree with us, we don't mind. For those of you who are not regular cider drinkers, most commercial ciders are around the medium sweet mark, so that gives you a point of reference. It's time to charge your glass. Wassail!

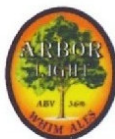
