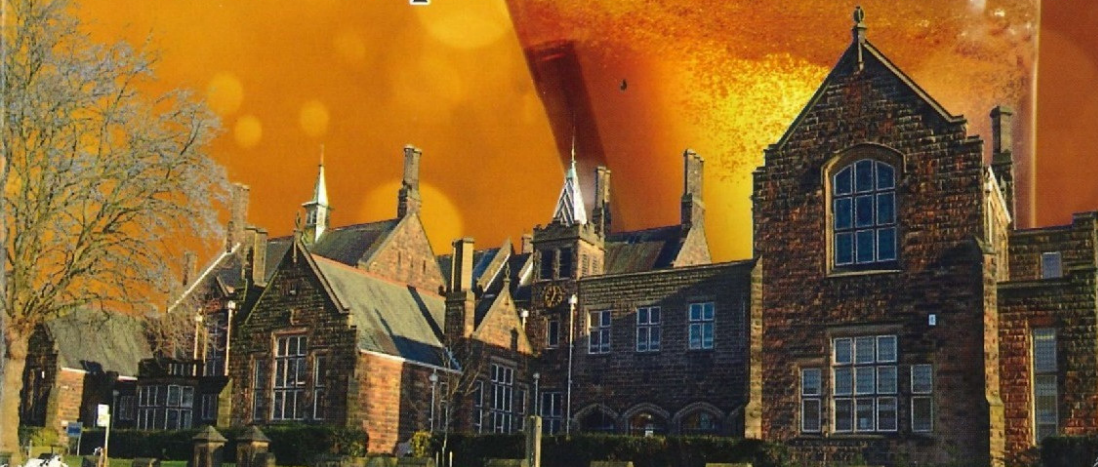

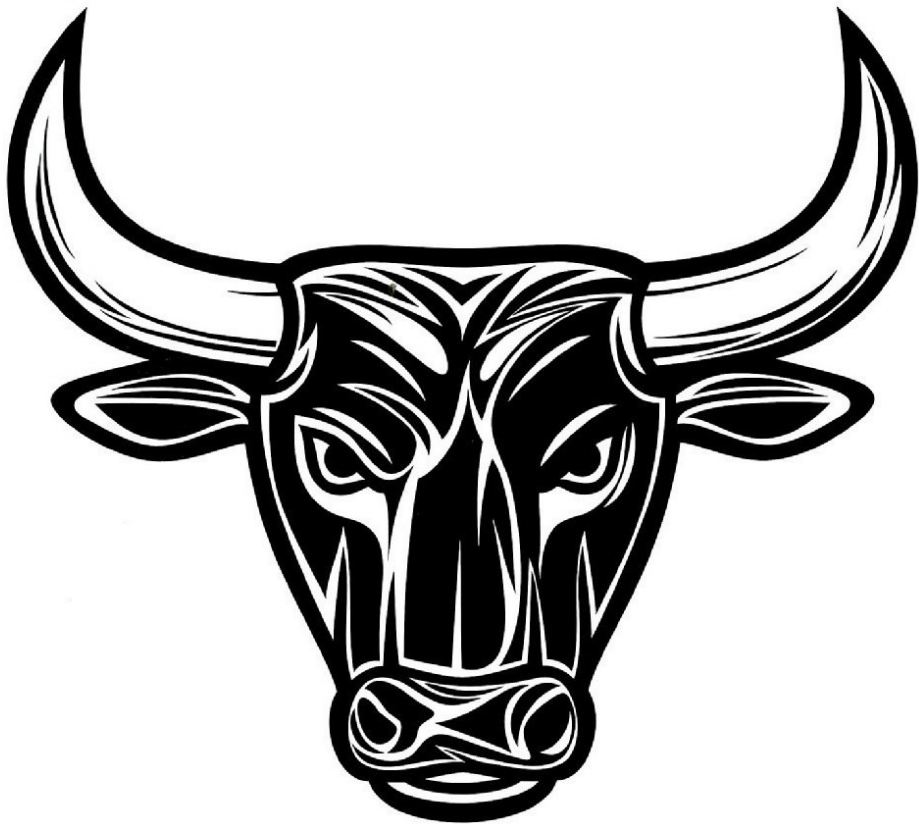

# Chairman's Welcome

Welcome to the seventh Amber Valley Beer and Cider Festival. We return to Struts after another successful year and are pleased to continue to support the restoration of this iconic building. Since last year room 10 has been completely refurbished and there is a brand new toilet block just before the main hall. Further work on installing a lift is due to take place after the festival.

Membership in our branch now stands at around 860, more than double what it was 5 years ago which is very positive news. Nationally, membership has now exceeded the 180,000 mark.

We continue to debate, discuss and campaign on important matters such as the beer and cider duty, supporting community pubs [including nominating them as an asset of community value (ACVs)] and the revitalisation project to help shape CAMRA's future. Your input, help and assistance on these is much appreciated.

Locally, on the pub front it seems the growing micropub scene is finally hitting our area with the Angels in Belper and the Bear and Monkey in Ripley being the first two to open this year. Alfreton will soon be getting its own Microbrew pub when Landlocked Brewery complete their move from the Honey Pot and open the doors of the Handle Bar (a former cycle shop) in October. These join others recently opened just outside our area such as The Town Street Tap in Duffield, The Redemption Alehouse in Heanor and Bunny Hop in Langley Mill.

Back to festival matters, I would like to thank all the volunteers involved. It takes 9 months of planning to put this together and a lot of people give up a lot of their time (some even book days off work) so you can enjoy the four-day event.

I hope you might consider being part of the festival planning team next year. Fresh ideas, discussion and debate are what will

drive the festival forward into the future and ensure that it remains successful for years to come. We are always looking at ways we can improve your festival experience.

Finally, please enjoy the festival and let us know if you have comments, suggestions or want to know more about being part of the planning team.

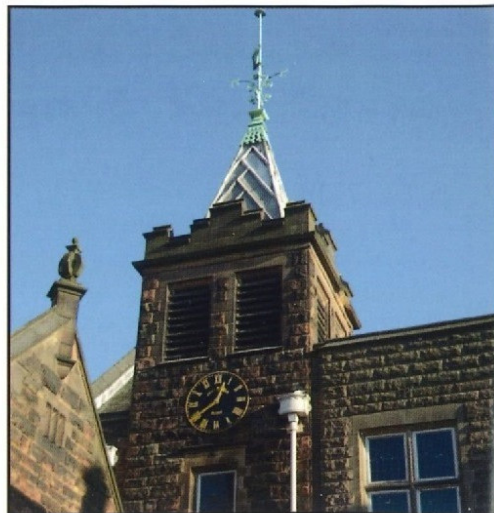



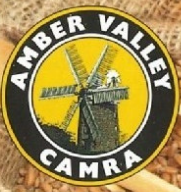

# Social Events

I took over the role of Social Secretary in November 2011, mainly to ensure that the monthly beer survey trips continued to run as I enjoyed them so much. These are free to Amber Valley members and take place on Saturday nights on a 16 seater minibus and we endeavour to visit as many real ale pubs in our area as possible over the year and collect beer scores for each pub along the way. Everyone scores their own beers on pre-printed sheets, based on the national CAMRA scoring system and these are then entered into the CAMRA National Beer Scoring database. Whilst we encourage members to input their own beer scores throughout the year via [www.whatpub.com](http://www.whatpub.com), these survey trips ensure we get scores for the majority of pubs in the area, most importantly those in small villages or rural areas that may not get too many visits from CAMRA members who input beer scores. Statistics taken from these scores are an important factor in choosing which Amber Valley pubs are put forward for entry into the Good Beer Guide each year.

Once again, we have had many members joining us for the first time on the trips this year and we always get a good mix of men, women, single people and couples with ages ranging from 18 to 80! The logistics of choosing a route each month based around picking up and dropping off everyone from Alfreton, Swanwick, Ripley, Kilburn, Belper and Heage is quite challenging to say the least but it always seems to work out alright on the night.

We have also had Saturday afternoon socials when we have used public transport then walked around some of the best real ale pubs in Nottingham, Chesterfield, Sheffield and Burton on Trent and also arranged for members to meet up to visit other local

CAMRA festivals. Other Branch members occasionally arrange "Amber Rambles" - longer, more adventurous walks around the local countryside on weekend afternoons, calling at some of our best real ale pubs along the way.

Our social events are advertised on our website, [www.ambervalleycamra.org.uk](http://www.ambervalleycamra.org.uk), in local CAMRA publications and the RuRAD newsletter and via the Amber Valley CAMRA Google Group which all members are invited to join. The Google Group is an easy way to keep in touch with other members and find out what's going on and also gives you access to minutes of Branch meetings.

I hope you may decide to join us on a social event soon. If you haven't been on one before, I can guarantee you will be made most welcome - it's a great way to make new friends who share an interest in drinking and promoting real ale and cider.

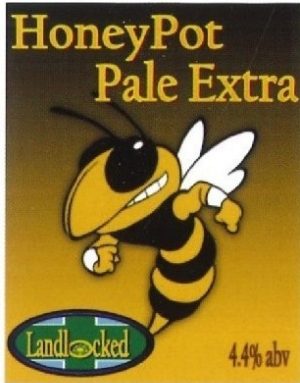

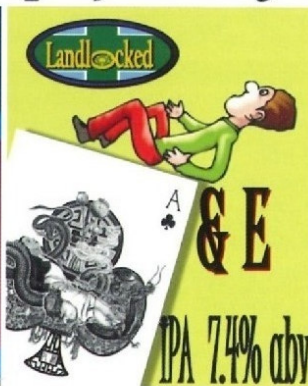

# Pub Campaigns Officer

I joined CAMRA over 20 years ago for one simple reason - I love real ale and wanted to help improve beer choice and quality!

A couple of years ago I found I had a little extra time to spare after changing jobs, so I decided to become more active within CAMRA. After going on a few beer survey trips I decided to volunteer to become the Branch Pub Campaigns Coordinator and Data Officer.

One of my main roles is to maintain and update the Whatpub database for our branch.

Whatpub.com allows anyone, not just CAMRA members, to search online for pubs and clubs and to look up opening times and other details, including any real ales and ciders they sell. Beer quality scores submitted by CAMRA members are also collected through Whatpub.com and these are used to help decide the Good Beer Guide entries for our branch each year. As a member you can help by scoring beer quality through Whatpub.com every time you visit a pub.

The Amber Valley Branch has 173 pubs, clubs and restaurants in the database, 101 of which sell real ale. It takes quite a lot of effort to ensure entries are kept up to date and we're always looking for CAMRA members to help. You can advise us of any changes you become aware of by using the e-mail link on the pub's own page on the Whatpub website or just drop me an email with any changes or comments you have.

If you have a little more time, you could adopt your local pub or other pubs in your local area. This may simply involve speaking to the licensee and acting as a contact point for changes to entries and may occasionally mean completing a survey form. You can choose how involved you want to be!

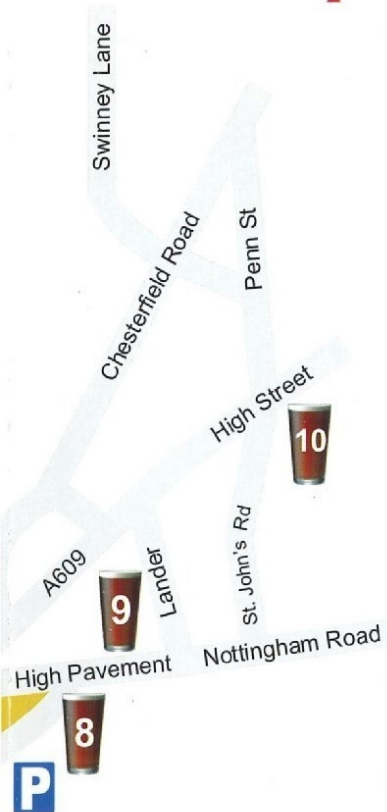

# Beer List



This year we have sourced beers from over 40 different breweries, a number of which are award winning and multi-award winning beers including this year's Champion Beer of Britain, Bingham's Vanilla Stout.

We have an ever changing variety of styles covered including speciality beers such as a traditional Scottish 80/- ale, a Red IPA, two green hopped beers, a chocolate and salted caramel Stout, a peach IPA, a beer made using smoked Ceylon tea, a Belgian Trippel and one made using cucumber and mint! These complement the usual traditional styles on offer.

There's a brewing revolution that's been happening in our nation's capital over the last few years and this is starting to head north. To reflect this we have beers from Wild Beer (famous for using their own wild yeast strain), Siren, Hammerton, Howling Hops, Redemption and Twisted Barrel.

The recent hop shortage seems to have yielded positive effects with more diversity in the beers available. Brewers have been forced to use different hops which has led to more experimentation, more choice and more differentiation. We feature some of the more unusual and newer hops such as English Keyworthy Early, Pekko, Jester, Comet, Azacca, Czech Kazbek, Polish hops Marynka, Junga and Sybilla and German hop Huell Melon. The tasting notes reflect which beers contain these hops if you are interested.

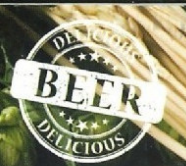

# Amber Valley Festival 2016

## Cider & Perry Bar

Welcome to the cider and perry bar. All the ciders and perries sold here are "Real" in the sense that they consist principally of fermented apple or pear juice respectively. Most of the ciders and perries here are, as previously, 100% apple / pear juice, although natural fruit flavours are now allowed and we have a couple of these. The ciders / perries are not artificially carbonated or served under gas pressure. This means that the majority are still, although because they contain live yeast the residual fermentation may produce a slight sparkle. They may be clear or hazy in appearance, but not seriously opaque!

The tub labels are colour coded green for cider and yellow for perry. They have all been sampled by your dedicated cider bar team and categorised as Very Dry, Dry, Medium Dry, Medium, Medium Sweet, Sweet or Very Sweet, and special features, such as fermentation in spirit casks noted. Feel free to disagree if you wish; taste is always a bit subjective and we like to have your views. Sometimes there are discrepancies between the tub labels and the program; this is inevitable since the program has to be produced some time in advance of the festival. If this happens trust the tub labels rather than the program. We are happy to give small tastes provided the bar is not too busy. Charge your glass and enjoy.

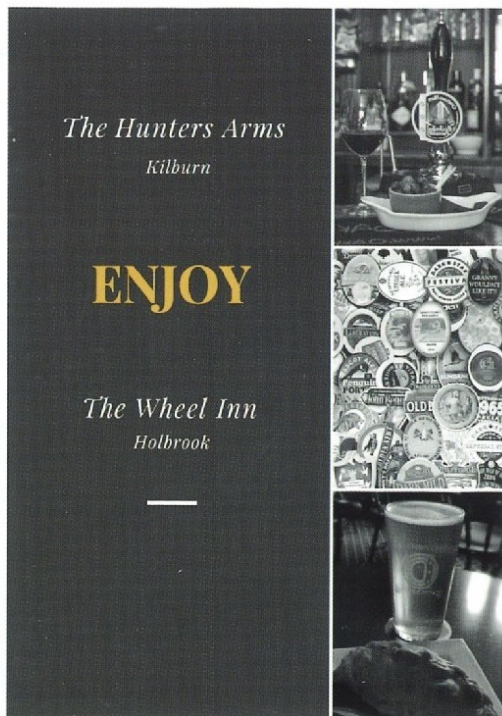

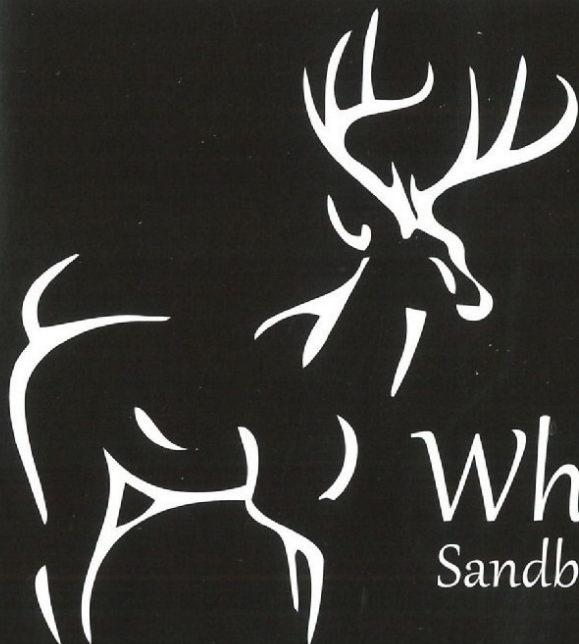

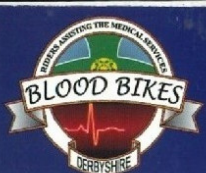

# Derbyshire Blood Bikes Appeal



Derbyshire Blood Bikes is a registered charity (1143149) that provides a free service to our local NHS, transporting lifesaving medical items for our hospitals. The service is provided by unpaid volunteers.

We are called on average two to three times every day to transport important or urgent blood samples or medication. We also transport donated breast milk into the national milk bank supply chain, used to support feeding of premature or seriously ill babies. If we can carry it safely, we will transport it.

### **Our aims are quite simple - to save our NHS money.**

We operate with 6 motorcycles and also a 4x4 vehicle for those times when the weather makes it unsafe to operate a motorcycle, meaning we will rarely be defeated by weather conditions.

In the first six months of 2016, we completed 332 journeys for our NHS, travelling over 16,000 miles. Taking samples as far as London and Exeter, Manchester and Leeds along with many points in between. The alternative to our free service is to call a local taxi company, which is at a high cost and a drain on the financial resources of the hospital.

This is the difference we can make, but we can only continue to do this with YOUR generosity.

We have three main roles within the charity - riders, fundraisers and controllers - and we are always happy to receive offers of help. Our riders need to be advanced qualified with a minimum of five years recent riding experience.

Fundraising is crucial to sustaining what we do and we are proud that we currently turn every pound donated into three pounds value for the NHS. But we could do much more and our volunteers are working closely with our local hospitals and the national blood service to improve our operating efficiency.

Our income is derived from local donations or fundraising events. You will frequently find us at local events explaining what we do and how your donations help.

Running our Blood Bike service comes at considerable cost, with maintenance, tax, insurance and, of course, fuel. We also have the challenge of replacing our motorcycles as they come to the end of their safe working life.

There are many demands on your hard-earned income. We appreciate that, but we also know from what you tell us that you like what we do for our NHS and you can be assured that every pound goes towards delivering the service.

Our challenge now is to replace two of our 650cc motorcycles, both being well over 10 years old. One replacement will become a liveried machine on the fleet. The other will remain a discreet vehicle which we hope to use as we develop a new medication delivery service for the Royal Derby Hospital.
