

## **Undermanned (and overwhelmed?)**

2009 was a difficult year, organisationally for the Derby branch. An under strength committee, further depleted by the loss of the chair mid term, struggled. The main activities, especially the re-scheduled 8th Winter Best Festival (the best yet) and the Good Beer Guide surveys (increased again to record levels) all happened, but social trips after a change of ownership virtually disappeared, the Mild Trail got lost and Pub of the Year contest was completed barely on time. In all it was a sometimes frantic year for those who had to make things happen.

Despite the loss of members with the creation of the Amber Valley sub branch, Derby still has one of the largest memberships in the country (1400+) and less than one percent of Derby members - who subscribe to what is supposed to be a campaigning organisation – actually get involved. We compare very poorly with our near neighbours Nottingham and Leicester, when it comes to the number of willing hands.

The effect of this is that Derby is unable to take on any new activities such as the Cask Week, as well as continuing to sustain several of its 'regular' tasks so inevitably we sometimes 'fall over'. Notwithstanding these hazards, we are campaigning for a recreational product and way of life, and, while there are challenges, campaigning can be fun.

The coming branch AGM is the opportunity for you, the branch members, to make a difference. We have no shortage of ideas, nor an unwillingness to experiment, just a lack of people to get the jobs, small and large, done. So we need more volunteers.

## **Derby Branch Annual General Meeting 2010**

The 2010 Derby CAMRA Annual General Meeting will take place on **Thursday 22nd April** at the **Flowerpot**, **King Street**, **Derby - 8pm** followed by a shortened Branch Meeting if time permits.

## Membership of Derby and Amber Valley Branch

CAMRA branch areas are determined on the CAMRA membership system by postcodes, and by default a member belongs to the branch whose area includes the member's home postcode. Members can choose to be a member of any other branch of CAMRA with the approval of that branch. All normal CAMRA meetings are open to any member of CAMRA, especially the Derby branch AGM which is also a social occasion, but members can only serve on the committee and should only vote at meetings in their own branch.

## Derby CAMRA Annual Beer Census Results 2010 More Real Ales per head than any other City

The recent Derby CAMRA Annual Beer Census saw the City try to recapture the title of 'Real Ale Capital of Britain',



which it has held on a number of occasions throughout the years. And although we don't claim to have the most number of different Real Ale available on any one day (our bigger City neighbours, Sheffield and Nottingham have recorded higher) we do claim to have more different ones available than any other City in the Country per head of population. So does that make us the Real Ale Capital, well I'll leave that up to you to decide?

This year's event saw 73 pubs visited during the evening. The idea was to determine how many different Real Ales were available in the City on any one given night and the results again proved startling beating last year's total by 12, quite impressive for a cold wintery night in February with less pubs being visited than last year. With no Real Ale available in 9 pubs and 8 Closed, the 249 Real Ales recorded (159 different ones) came from just 56 pubs, an average of 4.5 per pub. 9 Real Ciders & Perries where also found. Star pubs of the night included the Flowerpot with 26 Real Ales followed by Babington Arms with 17, the Brunswick with 15 and Old Silk Mill with 14. Marston's Pedigree is still the most dominant brand in the City available in 32 pubs easily beating its nearest rival Draught Bass whose decline continues and is now only available in 12 pubs, along way short of its heady days a few years back when most pubs stocked it. The average price of a pint on the night itself came out at £2.53 (10p up on the previous year) although in reality most City Centre outlets where far higher than this making Derby one of the most expensive places to drink in the East Midlands. The dearest beer was Hobgoblin at the Pitcher & Piano and Bass & Pedigree at the Waterfall all sold at £3 a pint with the cheapest being the discounted Greene King Ruddles Bitter at Wetherspoons for just £1.35. The beer quality throughout was generally found to be okay with a handful of pubs (mostly Derby's Good Beer Guide entries) serving really good quality ale. So there you have it, a few stats to bear in mind while crawling around 'Beer City' sampling one or two of the many different beer styles and tastes available. Real Ale

MINUTES OF THE LAST AGM AND EGM. Accepted as a true record. CHAIRMAN'S REPORT. Append Jok's report.

**WINTER 2008 ACCOUNTS.** Julian Tubbs introduced the accounts which were budgeted to make £5000. However, a

variety of factors conspired to make this not possible; the biggest reason was the theft of a sum of money, which had been the subject of a far reaching review headed by Chris Gale and Paul Gibson. £2000 had been lost due to this theft. Julian thanked the investigating team. No-one had been prosecuted despite being apprehended and the police being called and had not been charged or prosecuted after later thefts from other festivals. The report was available for members.

A vote was taken proposed by Kevin Hepworth Seconded by ?. Approved. **SUMMER 2008.** Carl Brett introduced the accounts. It was very successful with well controlled costs with sales up on budget – beer sales up etc. Auditors report for members.

Vote proposed by Kevin Hepworth, Seconded by Tony Saworth. Approved. **BRANCH ACCOUNTS.** Julian Tubbs spoke to members - 2007-2008 had seen lots more income from DD due to the sterling efforts of Jok Arguile. This had vastly improved from previous years. Julian also thanked Rob Davison for managing socials.

Amber Valley sub branch had been given £1400 budget for their area. Branch accounts were buoyant with more money need to be sent to HQ. Julian was stepping down as treasurer and subject to branch approval Jok Arguile was standing for new treasurer. Auditors report available. Prop Kevin Hepworth, Seconded Rob Davison and Approved.

**NEW AUDITORS.** All previous auditors were prepared to stand again. Keith Normanton for branch, Marie Gibson for winter and Sally Winterton for summer.

## CONSTITUTIONAL CHANGE.

Proposed that branch committee be increased by one to six other members and the Chair, secretary and treasurer. Konrad Machej spoke in favour and spoke of labour problems and not having manpower to do jobs.

Reg Newcombe spoke against the motion suggesting that there had in the past been an "open ended committee," which was not needed and that the branch had voted against increasing the size of the committee. He felt that not every new volunteer had to be on the committee and that decisions could be taken by fewer members. Julian Tubbs took the view the situation had changed. Terry Morton felt that we needed more members because many things had changed since the previous vote restricting committee numbers. Pip Southall spoke for approval. Steve Crispin proposed an amendment that all committee members should hold a definitive post and function. Seconded by Gareth Stead. Vote for amendment took place. Amendment defeated. Amendment proposed that the quorate number be increased from 4 to 5 in order to make a majority vote. Rejected on grounds of procedure. Tim Williams.

Jok spoke about giving members a voice and read out responses to his posted questions.

A discussion ensued with many points being raised. It was felt that the branch needed to be more welcoming and that socials should have a higher profile with visible committee members at meetings. Better and more notice and that M&B to be published a week before meeting. A discussion took place. Rob Davison felt that late publication was not acceptable but Kevin Hepworth felt we were all volunteers and had commitments. More interactive meetings. Jok felt it was down to Chairman's style? More transparent POTY, surveys etc. Jok gave responses. Postal nominations to all members? (Telford do) Survey forms to be made more readily available. Stewart preferred the national scoring system. Ideas were exchanged. Marketing for nbss? Avoid Camra jargon. Yes we should? Meet with friendly licensees? We do talk to some and have made improvements. Terry Morton felt that we didn't make enough of awards to pubs or licensees. Licensee of the month? Local issues. We should do more for landlords and issues. We are often called in now for comment or advice. Pub trails planned (in early stages). BLO officers roles in meetings? Programme of BLOs speaking is in operation sporadically. Rob Davison addressed members and spoke of Jok's last meeting as chair. He read out a minute from Eastbourne which awarded a special award to Jane and Jok Arguile. Jok was presented with a tankard and Jane a voucher for a garden centre. He spoke endearingly about Jok's time as chair. The branch thanked Jok and Jane for their work for the campaign. ## Hunters Heading In The Right Direction

Kilburn, six miles north of Derby, was, before the 20thC, largely owned by the Hunter family of Kilburn Hall. The gabled pub across the road from the hall was named after the family, and the Hunter Arms now seeks a restoration in fortune that saw it feature in the Good Beer Guide between 1983 and 1986. In July 2009, London born Paula Showers and her charismatic Canadian husband, Mark, sold their Torquay hotel and headed north to buy the Hunters. On the evidence of a recent visit, the Church Street pub is certainly worth frequenting with hand drawn Blue Monkey Original, Oakham Bishops Farewell and Leatherbritches Roasted Stout vying for attention. Meanwhile, on nearby Chapel Street, the Travellers Rest celebrated National Cask Ale Week with a Buffy's bonanza. No fewer than five of the Norfolk's brewery's beers were served direct from the cask.

## Ripley Rail Ale Festival



It's looking increasingly likely that Butterley station will stage the first CAMRA beer festival in

Ripley from Thursday, 30<sup>th</sup> September to Sunday, 3<sup>rd</sup> October. A marquee serving beer and traditional cider will reverberate to the sound of live music, whilst two railway carriages will serve additional ales in a quieter environment. In total, 50 real ales should be available together with food. It's hoped that the dual attractions of a beer festival and a gala diesel weekend will be a successful combination.

### Flourishing Membership

CAMRA's membership, which now exceeds 110,000, received a further boost recently when five new members signed up at the Talbot Taphouse, Ripley.
