#### Derby Pubs of the Year 2011

The Derby Branch Committee has undertaken a review of the POTY process after criticism of this year's event. The main outcome of which will be to move the timetable forward as it was felt the winners of the awards don't get enough time to celebrate their achievement within that year. Therefore the November Branch Meeting will see the shortlist of pubs chosen from the pre-circulated long list based on NBSS scores. Each member will be allowed to choose one City and one Country pub from the long list. The top 3 in each category will then go forward to the Judging round based on National POTY criteria. Any member can take part in the judging round which will require you to visit all six pubs.

The results will be declared in January and the presentations will take place in January/February. Gold, Silver and Bronze awards will be made.

We are also looking at the possibilities of introducing a proper awards evening when we will also present other awards as well which will be revealed in due course. If you would like any further information on this or would like to volunteer to judge then please contact us at:

Minutes of the Derby Branch Meeting held at the Station Inn in Derby on Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> June 2010.

35 at meeting.

**Apologies.** Ian Forman, Jok Arguile, Ray Smith, Sophie Tunnicliffe, Joy Olivent, Paul Cooper.

Mins of last meeting. As published in M&B. Bridgnorth not Bridgend. Erewash had been approached by a private company re – pub guide.

Matters arising. None.

Officers' Reports.

Chairman. Gareth said that all the Committee had been allocated roles and that Chris Sherratt was the new Pubs Officer. This meant that as required by HQ all the main roles were now on the Committee. Also following the Motion at the national AGM the committee had now decided its three campaigning goals for this year:-

- 1. Improve the website. This was felt a priority as the current site was suffering from lack of input due to their being no regular person to update it. Steve Crispin has been helping out temporarily. A new webmaster had been sought and a member had come forward and expressed an interest. He works for a web design company and the Committee would be meeting with him soon.
- 2. Discount Scheme. There was now a national discount scheme encouraging licensees to give discounts to card carrying CAMRA members but locally there was very little available. Nottingham has been doing this for years quite successfully and we need to take it up. It will be done by letter and through Derby Drinker. Participating licensees would receive free publicity in Derby Drinker and on the website and nationally through the new CAMRA website.
- **3. Locale.** Although we are already doing this it seems to have somewhat stalled recently with little evidence in Derby at least of pubs taking part. We need to relaunch it and Gareth will be speaking to Atholl Beattie our coordinator about it. Julian Tubbs said he has the 2010/2011 stickers and things.

Gareth also said that although these would be the main campaigning goals all the other campaigns during the year wouldn't be missed out on. He mentioned the current vacancies and appealed for volunteers. As well as those advertised in M&B we need BLO's for the Rowditch and Mr Grundy's. Kate Neale said we also need one for Whim and Julian Tubbs said this had been offered to High Peak Branch first. The new Government's planned proposals were mentioned: a community 'Right to Buy' the last pub in the village scheme, planning reform and possible big changes in the forthcoming budget. Gareth closed by saying that in these days of continuing pub closures it was nice to see three local breweries opening pubs, the Greyhound in Derby, the Barnes Wallis in Ripley and the Princess Victoria in Matlock Bath. He wished them all well. Secretary. Not at meeting.

**Treasurer.** Not at meeting, A full report had been delivered at the Committee Meeting.

Winter Festival. Anna Dyson spoke of the new venue at the Roundhouse and said that the dates would be 24-26 February 2011. Some posts filled but others vacant sponsorship. The budget was close to submission. Next meeting is 21st June at Brunswick, Tim Williams asked about the capacity. Ralf said about 4 times as much. Summer Festival. Martin Roden spoke of progress and appealed for staff. We need plenty of volunteers as we are now open all day at times. Charlie asked for a separate staff room. The beer list will appear on the website soon. Terry Morton spoke of the poster "keg run" prior to Falstaff POTY. Peter Elliot said it would be a good idea to advertise both Festivals on beer mats. Souvenirs were available at the meeting.

Derby Drinker. The new DD was out and Pip said it should be delivered asap as it was the Summer Fest issue. He appealed for articles for the next issue. Peter Elliot then raised the issue of the front page which he felt didn't advertise the forthcoming Beer Festival strongly enough and that the Editor was working within the constraints of the adverts. A full discussion then took place. One advertiser refused to move from the front page. Terry Morton felt that the poster should have been more prominent on the front page and he hoped that when the contracts for the adverts ran out it would be better next year. Gareth reminded everyone of the motion at the Branch AGM which said it was at the discretion of the Festival committees to request the front page without adverts and Martin Roden had not done this. Martin said he hadn't seen the latest issue but was happy to leave it to the editor's decision. Gareth said it would be raised at Committee level that contracts for front page advertisers would not include the two Beer Festival issues.

GBG/Surveys. Stewart Marshall spoke about the new pub database. He will produce survey stats in future. The Yahoo group now has 54 members. All welcome to join. We have still not got a survey trip organiser so please volunteer otherwise GBG entries may be chosen from members submitting forms outside our area. Gareth reminded BLO's to check their brewery entry in the GBG and for Festival Chair's to check their dates were correct in the GBG.

**Membership.** Konrad spoke about the membership being 114,000.

M&B. The latest edition had been printed at Staples again and sent to subscribers only. If anyone didn't receive it then contact Tim Williams and he will put you back on the list. The previous 2 issues had gone to all members and Colourstream had been used. Spare copies were available. Kate Neale said that she appreciated the timely delivery every issue. Tim said that M&B now had over 1000 subscribers.

Socials. Dean Smith spoke of the social calendar as published in M&B and WB and future socials.

Derby needs to take part in the judging next year. David Mountford of the Rising Sun would be speaking at the Regional about his problems with Punch. Paula Waters would also be at the meeting and as a former PTAG chair, transport issues may be discussed. Nottingham Drinker had won the award for newsletter of the year for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year in succession.

**Amber Valley.** First beer festival being run in October at Butterley railway. Please support it and volunteer to help out. Pip has been asked to edit the programme.

**Transport.** PTAG had been disbanded. Paula Waters would be at the Regional Meeting if members wanted to raise questions about it.

Pub Info. Plough at Weston-on-Trent had been demolished although work had been stopped at one point by Council intervention. Mitre at Allenton may become a Tesco. Five Lamps to re-open on 21.06.10. Mr Grundy's has planning permission for the brewery. Furnace closed again. Local residents had objected to the noise at the Greyhound on Friargate. The Victoria near the Station was being advertised as a pub opportunity.

AOB. Gareth said the next Branch Meeting would be more of a social meeting as we are presenting the POTY. It was raised that Diary clashes should be avoided wherever possible. Stewart Marshall asked about there being no agenda in M&B and said it should at least be available at the meeting.

Gareth said the final issue should be to wish England all the best in the World Cup!!! Meeting closed at 9.55pm.

#### The Beehive

In the late 70s. Steve Cresswell served his drinking apprenticeship at the John Thompson, Ingleby where he found JTS XXX, brewed on the premises, very much to his taste. For the past 18 years, Steve, a CAMRA member, has been running the Beehive, Peasehill, Ripley. During this time, he has purchased the pub from Home Ales, and now offers three constantly changing real ales. On a recent Amber Valley survey trip, the Blue Monkey BG Sips was on excellent form and the pub is open all day on Saturday and Sunday. The back garden is a delight and Steve is staging a beer festival showcasing a dozen or so beers between 20<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> August.

#### Marlpool

Marlpool, near Heanor, for so long a quiet backwater in brewing and beer circles, has sprung to prominence, Firstly following the Queens Head reopening last year, and now with the Marlpool Brewing Company



having fired its copper for the first time. On Sunday, 20<sup>th</sup> June, an informal invitation

was made to interested parties to sample the pilot brew. Word quickly spread and the cobbled courtyard was abuzz with chatter as the assembled topers eagerly downed the dry, pale 4.4% creation, brewed with Goldings hops and Maris Otter malt. The consensus was that this, as yet, unnamed beer, would be perfect for summer time quaffing. Look out for it at the Old Oak's RuRad bar and at the revamped Crown (ex-Que Sera), Church Street, Heanor.

#### Hunter's Arms

The Hunter's Arms, Kilburn has joined the growing band of Amber Valley pubs offering discounted beer to card carrying CAMRA members; 20p a pint in this case.

Meeting started at 2030 with 13 attendees. **Apologies for absence** Gus Manning. **Minutes of last meeting** Accepted as a true record.

Matters arising Pete H to speak to Holly at Waggon and Horses for an update on the Party in the Park.

Committee reports Chairman had nothing to report. Social Secretary, Nathan, said we would continue to have survey trips on Saturdays. Various reasons were given for members not supporting them. 17<sup>th</sup> July to South Wingfield and 21st August to Moorwood Moor. Nigel wanted information on survey trips and so Pete Hounsell will ensure Nigel is on our google group. Nathan said that although there were only a few AV members at the Duffield skittles match, there was another inter-branch social in the offing at Burton Bridge. Secretary, Paul, had been approached by Mansfield branch with a view to us joining next year's mild trail. He will contact Mansfield, advising them that 5/6 pubs may be eligible. Paul had emailed our new MP, Nigel Mills, asking for his support of Early Day Motion 210. Paul had received a positive reply that stated that our MP was a long-standing CAMRA member.
