As we're sure you all know by now the 10th Derby CAMRA Winter Beer Festival at Derby College's ROUNDHOUSE site is getting ever closer, please put the dates (24-26th February 2011) in your diary now! Please try to support us in any way you can, be it behind the scene's work, volunteering during the festival or just supping some beer. We're often asked a few of the same questions regarding the festival so to help answer them here's a few:-

Getting to the festival - that's easy... We plan to run a number of free shuttle buses from the City Centre to the beer festival almost every hour the festival is open. If that's not your cup of tea it's a short walk from the Alexandra Hotel / Brunswick into the college site - there's a gate off the 'Riverside Path' that will be open during the event to save walking round the perimeter of the site. Otherwise the bridge at the Railway Station, which has ticket barriers in place, will be open from 20:30ish every day to allow direct access to the Station Inn (and Arriva buses)!



**Beer etc**, we'll be having a wide range of beers with lots and lots of dark's and strong's as you'd expected from the Winter Festival, the main change this year is the beer will be conventionally stillaged (like in the Great Hall if you've been to the Summer Festival) so all of the beers will be available from the moment the doors open until they run out. We'll be having around 120 beers from near and far, along with a wide range of Cider's and Perries and Continental offerings.

"Cheese Man" at the festival, well it's true, plans are in progress for a prominent Derby city centre Cheese Merchant to be there selling his wares.

## Derby Branch Pubs of the Year - Selection Time


Yes, it's that time again and if you're thinking that it all seems to have come around rather quickly then you'd be right as the Branch has now moved forward the timetable for Pub of the Year selection so as to give the winners a whole year to celebrate their achievement.

The November Branch Meeting at the Old Spa will see the Branch Pubs of the Year short-listed and once again there will be a City and Country Pub of the Year Award with one overall Branch Pub of the Year Award from the two winners. Runners up will also

receive awards. Last year saw the **Green Man in Ashbourne** take the overall

award and the **Falstaff in Derby** the City
award and this year's
contest is sure to be as
keenly fought.

The POTY selection procedure and timetable will be as follows:-



- 1) A Long List of pubs will be created from the top 100 pubs according to NBSS scores and circulated to the M&B list in October. It will also be available at the November Branch Meeting.
- 2) A Short List of finalists, 3 city and 3 country will be chosen by branch members from the Long List at the November Branch Meeting. Each member can select 1 city and 1 country at the meeting.
- 3) Volunteer judges will then mark the shortlisted pubs based on the National CAMRA Scoring System during November and December.
- **4)** The results will be announced in January.
- **5**) Presentations will then take place during January/February.

No experience is necessary as you will be shown what to do before you start. If you would like any further information on this or would like to volunteer to judge then please contact us at:



Winter Festival. A budget scrutineer meeting had taken place re the budget. Hopefully the transport issue is being sorted. Revised quotes being sought for transport. All post filled on committee. Next meeting is on Mon 27th Sept at the Brunswick at 7.30pm.

**Summer Festival.** We need to decide if we will hold a 2011 festival.

Martin Roden gave a report on the last festival. There were not enough numbers through the door. As such the profits are substantially down on previous years. He suggested several reasons for the lack in numbers. All day opening had not worked. The Darwin had sold all its beer but lots left in main hall. Sale or return to be considered in future. Martin felt that the branch had not pulled their weight and Martin had had to double up on important jobs because there were no volunteers. Martin was thanked by the branch for all his sterling efforts in battling through in the face of adversity.

A branch discussion took place. Some thought a festival should take place, others felt that we shouldn't. The committee view was that unlike this year, we need a full team in place very early on, if we are to run with a 2011 festival. Health and safety issues raised by Ray Smith need to be addressed or we will not be able to get insurance.

Had there been some published misinformation or was there a lack of publicity. It might have been that advance publicity had been late in being published by the press. Perhaps we didn't get to our audience despite them going out. Under 26 subsidy had not been displayed or advertised. So only a third of what we

are used to under 26s turned up. We should learn by our mistakes if we run a 2011 festival.

The crux of the matter was that we are a large branch but have few people willing to take on important jobs.

Russ had put himself forward for 2011 festival and spoke about verbal assurances from nearly all key posts. Again he needed full help to run a successful festival.

## New Lease of Life For Thorn Tree

In the 1960s and 70s The Thorn Tree (pictured) on the A610 at Woodlinkin, near Codnor, was a popular Kimberley house run by the Bexon family. The Bexon's pioneered, locally at least, the



basket meal concept, though following their departure, the fortunes of the roadside tavern ebbed

and flowed as licensees came and went. A new dawn broke recently which, on the evidence of a recent visit, promises sustained prosperity. The other half and I dropped in on a weekday lunchtime to find the car park and pub packed. The draw, it seems, is Georges Tradition, whose award winning fish and chips are ordered at your table. We both chose haddock, chips, mushy peas and tartar sauce from the wide-ranging menu, washed down with a pint of Nutbrook Tradition. The bill, which also included a soft drink, came in at a reasonable £18.50. Taylor's Landlord and Black Sheep Bitter were also available on handpump. The Thorn Tree is open all day with last food orders at 930 and a Sunday roast is in the offing. It would be unsurprising to see further ventures such as this.
