Derby Winter-Fest is Back

Here it comes!! Yep the 10th Derby CAMRA Winter Beer Festival with a brand new festival venue – Derby College's Roundhouse (not the university as a lot of people assume) site on Pride Park, but to you fellow drinkers it's 'behind the railway station'. The dates are 24-26th February.

Transport is easy, you've got a load of options but primarily you can walk or cycle via Siddals Road (or use an Arriva bus as far as the Brunswick) and a short section of path opposite the Alex' leading you into the site from the back, or if that's not your thing jump on the free shuttle buses we're laying on from Full St to the festival from opening until 21:00ish from the City Centre. After the buses stop you'll be able to cross the railway using the bridge and use the Arriva routes from outside the Waterfall (opposite the Railway Station) if you're heading for town or outside the station for Alvaston and beyond (inc Loughborough & Leicester).

The beer, let's not forget that!! We're sourced a huge range in terms of style and brewery location so PLEASE do pop down to try them. If you want to know about the beers they're 4 ways to learn: a) Look at our website closer to the festival *www.derbywinterbeerfestival.co.uk* b) Read DD 138! c) Nip into the Alex and ask Ralf d) Come along and be surprised!!

But let's suffice it to say it's going to be far far better than Winter festival past, and the general verdict is they were pretty good.

Now for the other great thing – **food** to sustain you whilst you're working or just socialising we've got a range of things to tempt your palate the usual staples though nothing to radical, with a range of hot meals (not just with chips), sandwiches, snacks not to mention G Morgan & Sons (usually based in the city's Eagle Market) who will be providing our cheese stall.

The bands, another great line-up...tributes to Kasabian, Oasis, Stone Roses and sets from the girls who rock - the Alma Boobies and Punk favourites - Verbal Warning. NOW all this great beer, bands and food in an awe inspiring location with good transport links there's got to be a catch I hear you say?? Well not really BUT we do need a favour, a few hours (or a few dozen if you'd prefer) of your help both behind the bars and a heap of other tasks throughout the festival, in and out of the public eye. If you've never worked at the festival then believe what people say that it's the best way to see and enjoy the festival – and the staffing team will keep you sustained with some free beer tokens and a free workers thank you trip to Oxford on Saturday 5th March. Derby CAMRA Pubs of the Year 2011

The Derby Branch of the Campaign for Real Ale has selected its Pubs of the Year for 2011.

The City Pub of the Year is the Old Silk Mill on Full St in Derby with the runner-up being the Babington Arms on Babington Lane and third place the Horse & Groom on Elms Street.

The Country Pub of the Year is the Royal Oak in Ockbrook with the runner-up being the Barley Mow in Kirk Ireton and third place the Old Talbot in Hilton.

The Old Silk Mill takes the City title for the first time while the Royal Oak has been a previous winner of the Country award. Both will be presented with their certificates at the Derby CAMRA Winter Beer Festival trade session in the Roundhouse on Thursday afternoon 24th February. The runner-up in each category will also receive a certificate.

The competition as always was keenly fought with the shortlist of six pubs being drawn up by votes from the entire Derby Branch Membership. A team of 27 independent judges then visited each pub and marked the finalists over a six week period, visiting unannounced on different days of the week and at different times of the day. Each pub was judged in the following categories: - quality of the beer; atmosphere, style & decor of the pub; service and welcome; clientele mix; sympathy with CAMRA aims and whether it was a good value visit or not. The end results were close but both the Old Silk Mill and Royal Oak proved more than worthy winners where good beer and atmosphere are guaranteed and congratulations must go to each pub.

The Old Silk Mill has also been crowned overall Derby CAMRA Pub of the Year 2011 by virtue of having the highest overall mark and it will now go forward into the Derbyshire Pub of the Year competition. Here it will compete with the winners of other local CAMRA Branches awards from Amber Valley, Chesterfield, Erewash Valley, High Peak, Matlock & Dales, Mansfield, and Sheffield.

The winner of the Derbyshire round will be announced later in the year after a similar judging process has taken place.

(Branch committee had required an additional opening reception.). Kevin Hepworth asked if Olympics dates had been taken into account when planning the dates of the 2012 beer festival.

Socials. As published in M&B. Regional. Next regional meeting will at the winter festival. Sat 25th Feb at 12 noon. Transport. Next meeting in Bristol at Horts on 22nd Jan. Zig Zag had gone up. Information Exchange. Jok Arguile gave a detailed appraisal of the current situation regarding pubcos. Pubcos a thing of the past? Most pubcos who own 80% of Derby pubs are in trouble. We might have a chance to dictate which beers go into pubs. Punch (UK and Derby's largest pub owner) are in trouble having now disposed of 1000 of their pub stock of 7500 and plan to reduce this down further to 5000. In Oct 2010 they announced they were £160m in the red for the year, 11% of their property is boarded up / trading on a temporary basis. Their borrowing is £3.1 billion (= 5 x their share value). JLA expects this will provide more free trade opportunities and an easing of Punch's attitude to beer ties. Already in Littleover the White Swan has reopened with 12 hand pumps, as before, but with three local ales. This is a change in attitude by Punch and more in line with Enterprise where the Old Silk Mill features a big range of beers.

Molson Coors, uniquely for a major

brewer, opened a new cask ale brewery at

Burton on Dec 15th. The new 22.5 brl brew length plant is brewing cask White Shield, M&B Mild and plans a number of seasonal beers. Changes at the Flowerpot may result in reduction of beer choice and increase in wine choice. Consultancy firm employed. Lol Stevenson and others had left Flowerpot's employ. GBG entry and ressurection of the brewery now in doubt. Green Man at Ashbourne was closed and up for sale. It has been sold to Wetherspoons with Leatherbritches to leave the site. Landlady of the Shakespeare at Shardlow had died. Melbourne Hotel still closed with Bespoke having applied for a licence. Smisby Brewery (owned by Roger Thompson- Brewer Paul Szuta) now open. Julian Tubbs has visited brewery. Swan at Milton is still free with same licensee, Roger Salt. RE expect a review of Derby pubs to be in the Guardian in February. Chesterfield beer festival 4-5 Feb. Roebuck Melbourne closed White Swan Spondon has real ale. Victoria new landlord Cavendish for sale and boarded up Alexandra reopened with good selection of beers. Dancing Duck on at the Metro. Yahoo email- Derby Brewing Co have got beer that doesn't show origin and badged Real Brewing Co. This has been the subject of many emails and discussions. Technically this might be against CAMRA policy. Committee to discuss and Kate Neale to clarify as BLO. AOB. Dave and Lynn thanked for the sandwiches.

Oakham Bishops Farewell and four guests have been receiving rave reviews for a while now, culminating in it being voted Amber

Valley Pub of the Year, based on broad criteria, by eight judges.

Our congratulations go to Mark, and also to Roger, Francis and Tracey at the Old Oak, barely a mile up the road, in Horsley Woodhouse. The former East Mids Pub of the Year was adjudged runner-up with the RuRad bar continuing to be a big draw.
