The first beer festival at the Greyhound on Whitemoor Lane saw eager drinkers consuming the thirteen beers that complemented the quartet of ales that always feature. Peak Ales Bakewell Best Bitter was outstanding and summer and autumn festivals are planned. Jovial Tim, the landlord, selects two of his usual range from the SIBA list and, though the term "community pub" has become something

of a cliché, the Greyhound truly merits the description by catering for local families with wide-ranging events. The George and Dragon, Bridge Street, has a summer solstice festival from 16th to the 18th June, where Jiggery Folkery will take to the stage on Friday evening. This local folk/rock band is also due to appear at the second Amber Valley Rail Ale Festival at Butterley Station, Ripley on Friday, 30th September. The George, of course, still has the excellent Tower East Mill on draught at only £2.20 a pint to CAMRA members. Amber Valley's premier club for choice, the Strutt Club, Campbell Street, continues to excel with Whim/Marble Utopia a recent attraction. A tasting of the 5.1% brew suggested that it was of Derbyshire, rather than Mancunian, origin. Bradfield and Oldershaw breweries have also featured of late, and CAMRA members are always welcome here.

Fritchley, Pentrich and Nether Heage

Terry Harby of the Red Lion, Front Street, Fritchlev has completed the refurbishment of his 16th C Stable House that serves only local ale, cider and perry. Amber Ales brewery at Pentrich is staging a beer festival on the 17th and 18th June and a medieval style Braggot ale will doubtless be of interest. Amber Ales is the latest brewery to have its own complimentary club. Members of the club receive promotions, competitions and the latest news from the brewery. Since brewing began five years ago, innovation has been the hallmark of the Pentrich operation, and two free tickets for a brewery tour and tasting at the nearby brewery tap are on offer to a lucky club member.
