Summer Fest Success

This year we are thrilled to say there was a positive buzz around the Derby City Charter Beer Festival. A Marston's horse & dray travelled from the Alexandra to the Beer Festival to mark the opening ceremony. This was a great success as the Market Place was lined with crowds of drinkers that were eagerly waiting to get into the Assembly rooms. Indeed, even on Wednesday evening, there were queues stretching into Iron Gate. Visitors welcomed the small changes that were made to improve the overall feel of the festival. Real ale fans were thrilled to have a choice of over 225 different beers in over 350 casks and this isn't including the vast choice of continentals or the thirty-eight different ciders! The number of admissions increased by almost a thousand, with a total of 8703 through the door excluding the invited guests at the trade session. There has been positive feedback on the array of entertainment at the festival from string quartets to Cajun acts and blues bands. The chocolate and crisp stalls were new additions to the festival and greeted very favourably by both the visitors and the volunteers! CAMRA membership stall signed up ninety-one new members to the campaign, which is in its 40th year, and over 5700 commemorative souvenir glasses for 2011 were sold, which is a brilliant result. Beer of the festival was Dark Star American Pale Ale, with Fyne Ales Jarl voted runner-up. In third place was Ascot Anastasia's Excile Stout. Of course this year's success is in the hands of the 250 volunteers that worked long hours to make the festival work. A huge thank you for their dedication goes out to the bar staff, cellar team, Tango team, green room, sales & membership to name but a few that helped to put the event together. Come on Down, The Price is Right

The Abbey, in Darley Abbey, is probably the only pub in the Derby area where you can buy three pints and still get change from a fiver. Until October 1979, the village of Darley Abbey had no pub, which was a legacy of the philanthropic Evans family, who provided housing, schooling, a farm and even a pig for their employees who worked in the cotton mills. The Regency terraced houses are extant, as are the mills, though they, like the school, fulfil a different purpose now. The Abbey opened in '79, to much architectural acclaim, as a free house serving Kimberley Bitter and Marston's Pedigree, before Yorkshire brewers, Sam Smiths, bought the freehold in the mid 80s. Sam Smith's Old Brewery Bitter tends to polarise opinion; you either like it or you don't, and therefore their unfiltered wheat beer may be more to the liking of some. Sadly, the Undercroft Bar is no longer open to the public but it would be good to see a decent turnout for this month's social on the 24th.

He felt it had been a very good festival.

Russ spoke about the trade session which had been received as being very successful. 226 had attended. The branch congratulated the festival organising committee for running an excellent festival

More help graciously accepted. **M&B.** Paul Gibson spoke of technical difficulties with hard copies only. Deadline for next issue is the 28th. Despite inclement weather, Belper's 5th Food and Real Ale Festival was very successful with all of the pubs surrounding the town's Market Place reporting a roaring trade on Sunday, 17th July. The Eagle Tavern, Heage staged its first festival which featured a score of beers sourced from within a 20-mile radius, the only exception being Tim Taylor's Landlord.

Pub News

Innovation is the name of the game at the Thorn Tree on Ripley Market Place, where the former Mansfield house has introduced a generous real ale card scheme whereby the purchase of five pints is rewarded with a free one. There's plenty of choice too, with half a dozen handpulled beers usually available from Wychwood, Jennings, Ringwood and Marston's breweries.
