## GIMME SHELTER AT RIPLEY RAIL **ALE FESTIVAL**

No, this isn't a reference to last year's rain sodden, but successful, debut Amber Valley CAMRA Festival at Butterley Station, Ripley, but rather it alludes to the Rollin Stoned who top the bill at this year's event between 29<sup>th</sup> September and 2<sup>nd</sup> October. The festival, in a large marquee and two railway carriages, promises to be bigger and better than last year's, and, once again, the main sponsor is the Queens Head, Marlpool, with Ripley brewers, Amber Ales, also sponsoring the event. Our gratitude is also extended to Chris Burrows of Wade Printers, and R Shaw and Sons of Newthorpe. 80 real ales, traditional cider and perry will be the mainstay of a festival which has a stellar line-up of bands headed by the aforementioned Rollin Stoned on Saturday night. The Re-Entrants, a comedy ukulele duo from Derby, who celebrated their 250<sup>th</sup> gig at the Flower Pot in July, will kick-start proceedings on Thursday evening, and Friday sees Jiggery Folkery take to the stage with their folk/rock act. Returning by popular demand to headline on Friday night, are All The Kings Men, who took the festival by storm last year with their classy repertoire of rock and pop covers. Saturday afternoon sees those fine exponents of the 400 year old tradition of Morris dancing, the Ripley Morris Men, who are veterans of the beer festival scene. Then, in the evening, comedy skiffle band, Kick "N" Rush are the prelude to the Rollin Stoned. The Rolling Stones' cover are widely regarded as the pick of the Stones' tribute bands as they replicate every facet of the Stones' stage act. The power, menace and sheer artistry of the music, allied to the flamboyant costumes so characteristic of the Stones, perfectly capture 1960s hedonism. Culinary delights are assured with the Maharaja restaurant's Indian cuisine available for your delectation, and less exotic fare will be on offer, including a Pipers crisp stand. A new innovation this year, designed for those with a sweet tooth, is the specialist chocolate stall. Steam train enthusiasts will be able to travel to Swanwick Junction on Saturday and Sunday afternoons, courtesy of our hosts, the Midland Railway, Butterley. Subject to beer availability, the festival will be open noon to 3pm on the Sunday with ales at £2 a pint. Advance tickets for Friday and Saturday nights may be purchased from the Talbot Taphouse, Ripley, Dew Drop, Ilkeston, Queens Head, Marlpool, Hunter Arms, Kilburn and the Midland Railway at Butterley Station, Ripley.

Licensee, Andrew Caulton is however, bowing out with a festival featuring 20 beers, and we wish Andrew well in his future career. The

festival runs between 22<sup>nd</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> September.

# Lost Pubs of Amber Valley The first in an occasional series recalling pubs from the past

#### No. 1 The Grand Turk

In Lower Kilburn, Just across the fields to the east of the former site of Muddy Island, which was a substantial coal mine during the 19<sup>th</sup> century, is a perhaps unusually-named dwelling called Grand Turk Cottage. The cottage is situated on Derby Road, and the reason for the name is that it was formerly a public house called, appropriately, the Grand Turk. The Turk was a fairly small pub – it would be pretty full with 20 or 30 customers in it – and it served the Lower Kilburn community from the 19<sup>th</sup> century until the 1980s, when its doors closed for the last time. As for layout, the bar was to the right as one walked in, with the rest of the pub, which consisted of just a single room, housing a few tables and chairs. The beer on offer was Ansells bitter which, if memory serves me well, was usually quite decent. However, the location of the pub in a relatively small community, its size, the ease with which locals could travel to Derby and the number of larger pubs in the immediate area meant that the Turk was rarely full. Perhaps inevitably, closure came in the 1980s, and the Turk as a pub was no more, being converted into a cottage soon afterwards. Trevor Spencer
