### Lift Off In Ashbourne

The Ashbourne and District sub-branch of Derby CAMRA was inaugurated in the historic surroundings of the 16thC Smith's Tavern on 17<sup>th</sup> April. A well-attended meeting was chaired by interim Chairman, Dave Leigh, who said the initial emphasis will be on the social side and reminded members to visit their pubs and register beer scoring on the online National Beer Scoring Scheme to give a greater indication of beer quality in DE6 1 and DE6 2. The post code areas of DE6 3 and DE6 4 may be ceded to the sub-branch, subject to agreement with Derby. The NBSS (National Beer Scoring Scheme) is pivotal to Good Beer Guide selection. Monthly branch meetings will be held on the last Tuesday of the month, and Derby CAMRA invites Wirksworth members to the next one starting at 8pm on 29th May in the upstairs room of the Red Lion, Wirksworth, where nominations for the committee will be sought. Derby CAMRA hasn't always been able to survey the mainly rural area's pubs as frequently as is ideal and is looking forward to meeting Ashbourne and District members at the Brunswick branch meeting.

## **Campaigning Goals**

The new Derby committee met on 1<sup>st</sup> May and set three campaigning goals for the coming year. These are: the publication of a Derby real ale pub map, another mild trail for 2013, and encouraging members to survey more out of town pubs on the NBSS (National Beer Scoring Scheme) to give greater insight into beer quality in rural pubs.

#### Derby Chairman's Annual Report 2011-12

My second year as Chairman has been fairly eventful, but I have quite enjoyed it. I originally stood for the job on the basis of getting the Branch moving forward in the right direction and trying to get a few things accomplished along the way. Last year we managed to make a certain amount of progress with this and we have built on it further this year but there is still more to be done. **Branch Profile** – Last year I was keen for Derby CAMRA to raise its profile by staging major CAMRA events in Derby and we were granted the National Winter Ales Festival from 2014-2016 which was a tremendous high profile achievement for the Branch. Now we've also been told that we can hold another CAMRA Members' Weekend in Derby although the exact details and year are still to be ironed out. We have also continued to be highly visible around our pubs and have again held all of the Branch Committee Meetings at different venues so giving pubs that are not quite big enough for a Branch Meeting, the chance of holding a Committee Meeting instead. And we've tried to add a few new Branch Meeting venues to our list as well, with the likes of the Wardwick and Hope & Anchor in Wirksworth used for the first time. We will continue to look for new venues. Beer Festivals - It's been a year of contrasting fortunes for our two Beer Festivals. The Winter-Fest has had another tremendous year at the Roundhouse with attendances, beer sales, etc all up, which bodes well for the future as we gear up for National Winter Ales Festival in 2014. And the Summer-Fest thankfully picked up after a major downturn the year before, owing to improvements in certain areas, and we hope to build on these still further for the upcoming Festival in July. Campaigning -We set ourselves 3 campaigning goals at the start of the Committee year and have had some considerable success in achieving them. We decided to continue with Locale and the Discount Scheme for a second year to build on what we achieved in the first. Excellent coverage in the revamped Derby Drinker and on the website has meant that a lot more pubs have come on board for each and we now have both schemes firmly established. Our 3<sup>rd</sup> campaigning goal was to get a May Mild Month promotion off the ground as we felt in recent times we hadn't really supported it that well. This will be launched in May as a trail around Derby & Amber Valley pubs with details published in Derby Drinker and on the website. A big thank you must go to Dean Smith and Trevor Spencer for getting this Mild promotion up and running. And an update on our successful campaigning goal from the previous year which was to revamp the Branch website. This has now been awarded both East Midlands Website of the Year and Most Improved CAMRA website of the Year. This is a tremendous

achievement and credit must go to the Webmaster, Richard Mackney and his team for this excellent job. Membership -The Branch membership continues to grow and it is pleasing to see a lot more people joining the campaign both locally and nationally. One or two newer faces have appeared around Branch events and the challenge now is to encourage more of them to get involved whether that be just socially or by taking a more active role within the Branch itself. Publications -Derby Drinker underwent a major overhaul in September with a new team in charge and the revamped look seems to be going down well with readers, even receiving praise at national level. The lack of a dedicated Advertising Manager, however, has caused considerable problems in getting enough adverts in place to pay for it, but a recent appointment will hopefully get us back on track. Sub Branches - Our Amber Valley Sub Branch continues to go from strength to strength with two successful Beer Festivals in Butterley and a third on the way. Meetings and socials are well attended and for the time being they have voted to remain a part of Derby Branch. A second Sub Branch in Ashbourne is also in the pipeline and the first exploratory meetings have already taken place with others to follow. Socials & Surveys - It is not all about Branch business though as we all need to enjoy ourselves and relax and to that end it has been a fantastic year socially with some superb social and survey trips most of which have proved popular and well supported. However the lack of pub surveys outside of Derby is still worrying and is perhaps something we need to address in the coming year. Finally I'd like to thank the outgoing Branch Committee for all of their contributions this year and hope, next year, we can build on the good things from this.

#### Ripley Rail Ale Festival

The musical line-up for the 3<sup>rd</sup> festival at Butterley Station, Ripley, between 27th and 30<sup>th</sup> September, has been confirmed. All Fired Up and Whiskey Bob Shaker will get proceedings underway on Thursday evening, and on Friday night Pesky Alligators will support Jalapenos. Ripley Morris Men exhibit their traditional dance on Saturday afternoon. On Saturday night, tribute acts will pay homage to two of the greatest bands to have graced popular music in the last half century. Firstly, Fab 2 will mimic the Fab Four (The Beatles) and this year's headline act is Flash, who will pay tribute to Queen. Paul Falconer has succeeded Paul Gibson as festival Treasurer, and preparations for the festival are understood to be going well.

The Marquis of Ormonde, Denby Lane, Codnor has reopened after a 120k refit with the emphasis now on food and real ale. Hunter Arms, Kilburn is opening the Old Slaughterhouse bar on Diamond Jubilee weekend and it will serve ten beers and a hog roast on Monday, June 4th.

## Minutes of Amber Valley CAMRA Meeting at Thorn Tree, Ripley, 29th March

Meeting commenced at 8:35pm with 13 attendees. Apologies: Karen Guest, Paul Gibson, Anne Kennedy, Wendy Truman, Nigel Heathcote Minutes: accepted Matters arising: The St Georges Day Social is not going ahead, and Amber Ales have been informed. Regarding COTY, Trevor suggested that the self-nomination of Strutts be allowed to stand as he had be unable to contact Milford SC. Trevor has a list of clubs in the area, which he will forward to members. Officer's Reports: Chairman Nathan said we respond to relevante points raised at the Regional Meeting. Progress is being made, particularly in regard to Social events, and there was no real desire within the majority of the membership for independence, we are content to continue as a sub-branch for now. The only real

difference independence would make is the need to set a budget with HQ rather than Derby. Alison commented that those who call for independence do not, with few exceptions, attend Branch Meetings regularly. Derby is happy with us at present, so there is no need to push for independence at the moment. Trevor commented that the reason the issue of independence is raised is the fact we have run two profitable Beer Festivals, then handed the profit, which some would prefer to keep in AV, to Derby. However, there is a limit to the amount Branches can keep in their own account, so if we didn't pass the bulk of the profits to Derby they would go to St Albans. An Ashbourne subbranch is likely, probably tied in with Wirksworth, and this seemed the way forward for many larger branches to delegate beer surveys and GBG selection, as sub branches are given their own allocation of Guide entries. Social **Secretary** Jane reported enjoyable Branch trips to Burton Festival and the pub Festivals at the Cross Keys, Grapes and Seven Stars in Belper. April 1st Social at the Talbot Taphouse, the Survey Trip on April 14<sup>th</sup> and Anne Kennedy intends to organise a second "Amber Ramble" on June 30<sup>th</sup>, starting from John Flamsteed School in Denby, and walking to Waingroves, Peasehill, finishing at the Talbot, Ripley, who are holding a Beer Festival that weekend. Re the proposed Survey walk around Belper on June 4th would many pubs hold a Beer Festival that weekend?, but pubs tended to keep their regular beers on as well, so a survey was still feasible. Using public transport, we'll meet at noon in the Cross Keys, Belper. Branch Secretary Trevor asked for information on cider activity in AV. Phil said the King Alfred serves real cider, as does the Black Boy, Jane said. The recently reopened Black Bulls Head also has a regular cider on. Membership **Secretary** Phil told the Branch that the last month had seen 14 new members joining, with 1 transferring in and 6 lapses. He had had a few replies to his initial letter and subsequent newsletters regarding volunteering, and one member had requested not to be sent future issues of the newsletter. Future Branch Meetings: May 31st the Pear Tree, Ripley, June 28th at the Cross Keys, Belper and July 26th meeting at the Devonshire Arms, Alfreton, TS to book. Beer Festival: We have a Treasurer, the budget has been approved and bands provisionally booked. Phil is making progress with the beer order, and we are ahead of schedule. Mild Month: Trevor distributed copies of the item which will be in DD. He had contacted 45 pubs, receiving positive replies from 11, which combined with Derby meant we

have 22 pubs on the Mild trail. Nathan commented that a lot of hard work, by Trevor and Phil, had gone into the AV mild trail, and reflected well on AV. Mild crawls on 19th and 26th May discussed, and Phil suggested a mini bus from Ripley to Belper, Openwoodgate, Milford and Makeney after covering the Ripley pubs. Trevor will ask Derby Committee and report back to Branch. Pete said that 4 different buses needed to do whole crawl in a day, so we could have different teams for different areas. Liaise with Derby before final decision is taken. Some pubs selling mild for the first time, so it is important to support them. The majority felt there should be free beer at the next Derby Beer festival, for those visiting 8 out of 22 pubs. Trevor asked if all AV Mild Month pubs receive Derby Drinker, Alison will check this. AOB: Pub news -The Nelson and the Canal, Bull Bridge appear closed. Titanic Brewery passport scheme discussed. The Green Man/Blacks Head at Ashbourne to be auctioned April 14<sup>th</sup>. The Headmasters Office, Kilburn is still closed, but there have been signs of occupation recently. George and Dragon Belper is now the Shottle Brewery tap, with 3 beers on regularly. The Pear Tree, Ripley is now allowed to serve non-Greene King Guest Beers, while the Beehive is still selling Real Ale at £2 per pint. Stables Bar open Easter? The Patten Makers, Duffield has bought the Duke of Clarence, Derby, which is now free. A review of County and Regional allocations for future GBGs is in the offing. Please donate prizes to festival Tombola stall.
