The Derby City Charter Beer Festival has come a long way since its inauguration at the Kings Hall, Queen Street, in 1978, when it was underwritten by members' personal loans to the tune of £1,025-about ten grand in today's money. Back in '78 there were just 40 beers from 20 breweries, and the three day event closed at 10 in the evening. Breweries tended to be of the old established variety, such as Ruddle's and Shipstone's; fine brewers who have sadly slipped into history. The micro-brewery revolution was in its infancy with the likes of Peter Austin (Ringwood) and our very own John Thompson in the vanguard of new brewery activity. Next month's festival at the **Assembly Rooms** will feature a veritable cornucopia of real ale, almost an Arcadia of the UK's brewing industry. We can also expect to see continental beer on draught, a mead bar and the ever popular Cider & Perry bar. Entertainment this year will be varied from a String Quartet to Folk Music and Rock. Local Bands will include Lil Jim's Big Squeeze, Old Skool & Radio Mary. One tribute band will feature on Saturday night which will be 'The Small Fakers'. With the help of Marston's the committee are also hoping to launch a 'Real Ale Trail' of Derby. This will be a good opportunity to encourage people to visit local pubs around the city prior to the festival. There will be a map along with a stamp card, and if all stamps are collected there will be a free Ale Trail T-Shirt to collect from the festival, more information to follow. Opening times for the festival, which runs between 11th and 15th July, will be slightly earlier than previous years with an 11am start Thursday-Saturday. The theme for this year is 'Celebrating 50 Years of Derbyshire Wildlife Trust' and, aptly, the festival logo is of a Peregrine Falcon. There will be a 'DWT' stall at the festival for anyone who requires information on joining or getting involved with local schemes. Coming along to the festival also proves to be a charitable act; in March the committee donated a cheque of £1000 from last year's profits to the Mayor's Charities. This money will go towards helping Diabetes Research, Children's Mental Health and The Neo-Natal Intensive Care Unit. The pre-festival keg run is Tuesday, 26th June, meeting at the Ram statue on East Street at 7pm. Please help us to distribute flyers and posters.

Minutes of April 26th Amber Valley CAMRA Meeting, Victoria, Alfreton

The Meeting commenced at 20:35 with 8

members in attendance, apologies from

Anne Kennedy, Mark Little, Nathan Dilley, Nora Harper and Nigel Heathcote. Minutes – accepted as a true record Matters Arising - none Officer's reports - Chairman - not present. Secretary -Branch Meetings at the Pear Tree, Ripley on May 31st and the Cross Keys, Belper on June 28th and brief discussion on Social Secretary Jane's report, who is away. The last survey trip to South Wingfield and Oakerthorpe had been disappointing, with only a total of 13 beers in the 5 pubs. Phil said unfit, left over beer from Blue Bell's beer fest at £1 a pint. He felt the pub needed to be advised not to serve stale beer in the future as this would be bad for the reputation of Real Ale in general and the pub in particular. Alison had had similar experience elsewhere. The May 12th survey trip has been changed to cover Codnor & Riddings, and the Talbot Social on April 1st had been enjoyable. Anne Kennedy is to lead an Amber Ramble on June 30th. Membership Secretary – Phil said that we have 18 new members, with 4 transferred in, but there have been 14 lapses and 3 transferred out. It is difficult to keep track of the lapsed members as he has no contact details, but no negative comments have been received re the Newsletter/website. Beer Festival – Phil continues to work on beer list. Fencing around the Festival area? The price for 120 metres is reasonable, but problems lie in erecting it. The proposed posters and flyers also need some work. Sponsorship looking very positive, but there had been some resistance from Midland Railway to several proposals, and the site is

increasingly expensive. Alison suggested Lumb Farm as alternative site, although transport links are better for MR. To be discussed in more detail post-festival. Mild Month 2012 - Trevor informed the meeting that there are 24 pubs on trail -13in AV and 11 in Derby. Crawl dates are May 12th – Derby and Erewash: 19th Amber Valley: 26th Derby trip to AV. As for awards for the best AV mild pubs, Trevor suggested a system by which those sampling mild in the Trail pubs be encouraged to rate the beer, either via the chart in Derby Drinker, or by contacting him on text or email. Phil said measurement of quality was good idea, while Alison commented that making award in AV would encourage pubs in future. **AOB** – Paul said that the Marquis of Ormond has reopened. Alison commented that they are keen to serve Real Ale, and are currently using the Coors list. Trevor said the Hunters Arms will open the Old Slaughterhouse, and will serve 10 beers. The Stable Bar at the Beehive is progressing steadily, while the Midland to serve Real Ale, the former licensees having left the trade (AC). The White Hart at Bargate is now open, having been fully refurbished, and recently held its first Beer Festival (PG). The Ashbourne sub-branch, which includes Wirksworth, is now established, with the next meeting on Tuesday 29th May. Alison suggested we might organise a joint social with Ashbourne once a Committee is in place, particularly as the Wirksworth - Duffield train line runs in the summer. Phil said that this would encourage the new sub branch, so Alison will check the timetables. Paul commented that they have an interim chairman, and hope to appoint a full Committee at the next meeting. Phil said that he has had word from HO that newsletters need to be sent to the British Library, to which Konrad commented that all newspapers etc are sent there, but tend not to be read. Phil also requested feedback and /or suggestions for the website as he was not always aware of events taking place in AV. As for Alfreton, Mark Thorpe said that the Wagon & Horses had improved its beer range since Andy Brett had transferred there, and now plan to hold "meet the brewer" evenings every month. The King Alfred has good beer, but tends to do very little advertising, with a recent Cornish Beer Festival passing unnoticed. Phil said that Bunkers Hill, in Nottingham, gives a CAMRA discount on comedy nights. The meeting closed at 21:35.

Minutes of the Inaugural Meeting of Ashbourne & District Sub-Branch at Smiths Tavern, Ashbourne on 17 April 2012

Chair David Leigh. In Attendance: 10 Members present including Julian Tubbs, Regional Director of CAMRA and Derby Branch member. Apologies for absence:

None. Chairman's Report Dave confirmed that Ashbourne is now formally recognised as a Sub-Branch of Derby CAMRA although the formal paperwork has yet to be completed. Area of Coverage The area proposed by the Regional Director is DE1-DE4 plus Wirksworth although this had to be confirmed by their members. The Group would cover an area around Ashbourne from Parwich to Marston Montgomery; Brassington to Wirksworth. It was proposed that the DE6 postcodes (Brailsford & Ednaston, Hulland Ward and Longford) would stay with the Derby Branch. The Chairman said that a decision about coverage had been taken at the first meeting and this included Brailsford, Ednaston, Mercaston and Hulland Ward. The Regional Director reported that this was not the case and any final decision would have to be agreed with the Derby Branch. A member from Brailsford asked for this decision to be reconsidered. Although a long standing member of CAMRA they had never been active or attended any Branch meetings and were unlikely to do so if they remained allocated to the Derby Branch. In any case all areas under discussion, including Brailsford & Hulland Ward were in the Derbyshire Dales administrative areas and it made sense to keep them together. Those present agreed with this view and the Chairman will represent this as the Sub-branch position at the next Derby Branch meeting on 10 May. Branch Structure and Constitution Once all paperwork is complete the Chairman will have access to a full set of CAMRA documentation including a model constitution which needs to be adopted by the Branch. Although a Subbranch can function with just a Chairman it was recommended that other committee posts are appointed as soon as possible: secretary, treasurer, membership secretary, pubs organiser and festival organiser. The Chairman confirmed that he had taken the post as an Interim measure and was looking for other members to come forward and fill the formal positions. Appointment of Committee members would be an Agenda item for the next meeting. Frequency of Meetings It was agreed that the Branch would meet monthly; with a mixture of formal meetings and visits. Meetings would be held on the last Tuesday of the month. There was a suggestion that every other month there should be a visit ideally taking place on Saturday/Sunday. This arrangement to be confirmed at a later date. Agendas There is a recommended agenda for meetings with a number of standing items:

- Minutes
- Campaigns
- Membership
- Good Beer Guide.

Although it is preferable to have a separate room there is good experience of holding meetings in open bar areas which often attracts interest and new members. Separate accommodation is only required for formal discussions relating to people or finance. Transport Ashbourne Community Transport could be approached. The Group would qualify if it had a formal constitution and objectives relating to community issues such as preserving the rural pub. Branch Interests & Expectations It was agreed that the Branch would start mainly as a social group arranging

outings and visits to pubs within its patch. The first visit would be to Wirksworth to gauge the level of interest there. Meeting/Visits Wirksworth members would be invited to attend the meeting on 29 May, to be held at The Red Lion in Wirksworth. Invitations would be issued by the Derby Membership Secretary and Derby Branch would also arrange the venue. The Chairman would ensure that the meeting was publicised in Ashbourne. A further meeting of the Sub-Branch was planned for 26 June at The Horns in Ashbourne, 2000h start. Local Pub Survey A Local Pub survey to be undertaken as the Branch would now be responsible for making recommendations for the Good Beer Guide. The Regional Director stressed that this survey should be undertaken in accordance with CAMRA's scoring system which is available to members through the website. This would ensure some consistency in the process. Number of entries to the Good Beer Guide to be advised. The standard of pubs across the country is generally good and rising; therefore competition is fierce. The number of GBG pubs is under review by the National Executive and recent decisions may lead to a reduction. Publicity Events to be held in June and beyond can be publicised in the May edition of What's Brewing and Mild & Bitter. The Chairman will ensure that there is local publicity, including advertising in all Ashbourne pubs, and through the News Telegraph and Ashbourne Radio. It was agreed that a local email group should be established. Members provided email addresses to the Chairman. The Regional Director asked that the Group ensured it was adhering to the Data Protection rules when setting up an email
