Our Day in Parliament

Wednesday 12th December 2012 was indeed a very historic for CAMRA with the purpose of lobbying MPs in support of scrapping the beer duty escalator. Derby branch was represented by Ray Smith, John Kearney, John Aldridge, Julian Tubbs and I. We were welcomed at the Emmanuel Centre (near the House of Commons) by volunteer stewards who offered tea & coffee as we were registered – this was all very well organised considering over 1000 supporters turned up, we were led in groups to the Parliament building and went through airport type security to Westminster Hall where more friendly stewards (including our own Kath Lilley) directed us to the central lobby which was very crowded with CAMRA members talking to MPs. My particular MP for Derby North was not available but 4 of us had a good chat with Pauline Latham MP for Derbyshire Central in the Strangers bar, she sympathised with our cause and was very supportive. She also wanted to know which micro-breweries were in her constituency with a view to serving them as guest beers in the Westminster bar. We then returned to the Emmanuel Centre for a couple of free pints courtesy of local brewers and listened to the rousing speeches as documented in What's Brewing. Being a CAMRA member since 1974, it gave me a humble sense of achievement being a small part in getting parliament at last to listen to CAMRA. This all seemed far away from arguing against Derby branch's obsession with concessions at beer festivals in back street pub meetings. But hey ho! – All part of the democratic process. **Terry Morton**

Minutes of the Derby CAMRA Branch Meeting at the Horse and Groom on 6th December

Apologies for absence. Konrad Machej, Julian Hough, Adrian Howell. **Minutes of last meeting.** Accepted. **Matters arising.** None. **Chair.** Lobby of Parliament 12th December. Winter Ales Festival- 23-26 Jan. April members' weekend registration is now open. Champion Beer of Britain voting is also open via the website. Xmas show - tickets from Ian. POTY judging is on-going. Branch vacancies (see M&B) and we need leaders for the ABC crawl. **Secretary.** Christmas show tickets on sale. **Treasurer.** AV made modest surplus (affected by weather). AV had paid VAT. Summer festival accounts nearly ready for auditor. DD invoices out with money trickling in. Branch account healthy- all loans repaid. GBGs paid for. **Secretary started taking minutes at 8.40pm.** **Campaigning.** Stewart Marshall gave details of individuals' NBSS surveys which showed we need to do more! Locale pubs increasing. **DD.** Next issue Jan/Feb before Winter festival. New designer needed. **GBG and surveys.** What Pub? has been modified to allow surveys-mobile version next. Any committee member can submit scores for others. Volunteers needed for GBG pub descriptions. Deadline 25th Jan 2013. M&B copy deadline 24th Dec. **Regional meeting.** 1st Sat in March. We are to host the June 13 meeting. **Socials.** Dean had published details in M&B. He told members of forthcoming socials. **Sub branches - Ashbourne.** Chair, Mark Grist, told of developments for beer festival. High profile guest proposed. Volunteers needed. Details on website. 22-24th March at Ashbourne Town Hall. Live music planned. Beer list being compiled. **Amber Valley.** Unanimous vote at AGM for full branch. NE to be asked to sanction the branch. New chair is Chris Rogers. **Beer Festivals - Winter.** The budget had not

been approved. Resolution had been sought with NE involved. Colin Valentine had sent an email ordering us to charge CAMRA members. Representations are still being made but we seem to be forced to act as the scrutineers want. Gillian Williams spoke of discussions and problems. The issue continued to be the free entry of CAMRA members. Julian Tubbs and Gillian had had extensive discussions with no suitable resolution. No extra branch committee meeting was possible but discussions and cuts had been submitted but the budget was still not acceptable for the scrutineers. Julian spoke of the “ugly” nature of the discussions. We were at version 8 of the budget and thought we had met CAMRA criteria. This was not the case. He felt that this was against internal policy. It appears that members free is no longer acceptable. He felt that we should submit a motion at the members weekend to show our displeasure. Gillian spoke about us being cast in a bad light. These decisions had implications for the National Winter Ales festival with little likelihood of any concessions then. Joy Olivaint spoke of other festivals charging. Some festivals have always charged. Objections from the floor spoke of discontent at the correspondence that had taken place. Sue Lawson spoke of the loss of campaigning re the under 26s. Members spoke of their disquiet and urged to make a fuss at the members’ weekend. Tim Williams spoke of HQ directive to not dictate terms to running festivals. He quoted at length from published documents that contradicted what had been imposed on us. Russ pointed out the personal nature of emails received. Jok spoke for the need for us to pursue our own business model not the NE. Further representations to be made at Llandudno this weekend. Sue Lawson asked for an alternative vote to not hold the winter festival. Stewart Lawson asked for a vote of no confidence in NE. Julian Tubbs then proposed a vote to approve the budget and to charge members, under protest, at the 2013 winter festival on Friday and Saturday nights to allow festival take place with the protest taking place afterwards at the National AGM members’ weekend at Norwich. Terry Morton seconded it. A vote took place and was carried on a majority. **Steve Crispin’s Motion to subsidise the marquee.** He spoke and proposed his views. Gillian spoke of £7000 shortfall for marquee etc. Gillian spoke of lack of clarity of budgets. Motion was then withdrawn. **City Charter Festival.** Still two posts needed. One was treasurer. Jok Arguile asked that the festival be abandoned as we could not resource it. Russ to report to next committee meeting in January. Decision to abandon would be taken then. A discussion ensued. Russ Gilbert spoke of commitments he may have to make in the future. It was decided that these matters would continue in committee. **Pub information.** Osmaston Park Hotel now a

carpet shop. Green Man Black’s Head had been sold-mystery buyer. Smithfield opening delayed. **AOB.** None.

Subject to budget approval, the 4th Amber Valley CAMRA Beer and Cider Festival will be in the Bowls Room, Alfreton Leisure Centre between 12th and 15th September. Difficult access and sometimes treacherous conditions underfoot hastened a move away from the Midland Railway Centre, Butterley, which hosted the first three festivals. Deputy Festival Organizer, Nigel Heathcote, said “in some ways it’s a wrench to be leaving Ripley but we’re confident of sustaining the progress we’ve made, particularly with the history of several successful Derby CAMRA festivals at Alfreton Leisure Centre in the 1980s. Indeed, it was here that I attended my very first CAMRA beer festival so there is something of a feeling of déjà vu”.

Steve and Becky are making a big effort in trying to establish the **Hop Inn** at Openwoodgate. In addition to a wide range of real ales, they have a new food menu and accommodation is available in the form of twin rooms at just £30 per night. The **Greyhound**, Whitemoor Lane, Belper, has a beer festival between the 24th and 27th January. It’s a sad sign of the times we live in that the **Horse and Jockey**, Somercotes, has had real ales advertised at just £1 a pint. **Midland**, Nottingham Road, Ripley, has the multi award winning Thornbridge Jaipur available permanently at a bargain £2.85 a pint.

Minutes of the Amber Valley CAMRA Branch Meeting, Hunter Arms, Kilburn, 29th November

The meeting began at 9:20pm with 36 in attendance. **Pub of the Year:** judging of the 8 finalists happening now. We have 18 judges, and new Chairman Chris Rogers appealed for more, with one member

responding. Judging forms to be returned by January 5th so result can be announced at January 10th Branch Meeting at the Waggon & Horses, Alfreton. Winter Ales Trail-posters available. **Surveys & Socials:** Next survey trip scheduled for Saturday 15th December to pubs on the periphery of Belper, while in January we are having a walking survey in Alfreton, meeting at the Waggon & Horses at 1pm. Chris suggested that a Social, to be held at the Black Bulls Head to celebrate Branch Independence, after December 7th. **Pub News:** Alison said that planning permission for change of use had been granted to owner of White Hart, Heage, and Chris Burrows said that the Queens Head, Marpool is to be run by Pub People, who own several pubs in the Nottingham area. The Gate Inn, Swanwick is closed. **Events:** Mass lobby on December 12th, to which Nottingham CAMRA are running a bus. Derby CAMRA Footlights Review on December 13th and the Derby Winter Beer Festival starts 20th February. **Beer Festival 2013:** After 3 successful years at Midland Railway Centre, it may have to move as MRC had bumped the price up to an unacceptable level. Swanwick Junction had been considered, but this has no road access and is also expensive. Of the various other sites looked at, the most promising is Alfreton Leisure Centre, which is both inexpensive and very accessible by public transport. It would no longer be the Rail Ale Festival, and some concerns as to the lack of atmosphere of such a venue were expressed, but Chris commented that we can create our own atmosphere, while Phil said the Festival would be in the bowls hall rather than the gym. Belper Rugby Club, not previously considered, was suggested, and Chris suggested a meeting for Dec 6th, to make a decision on the venue and appoint a Festival committee, with a visit to Alfreton Leisure Centre beforehand. Alan Ward said this would be a completely new festival and the budget would be needed by end of March, so a decision was urgent. **AOB:** Local guide for AV? Alan Ward said Trent Barton approached with a view to them supporting CAMRA in this, but no response had been received. However Jane commented that TB interested in supporting AV through their Face Book page, so perhaps a future public transport/pub guide was possible. **Meeting closed 9:40pm**

Minutes of Sub-Branch Meeting at Sycamore Inn, Parwich, 27th November

13present. **Apologies** Mark Tyack **Notes of Meeting 30 October 2012** had been circulated and confirmed by the meeting. **Matters Arising** Covered by the Agenda. **CAMRA Activity** The Sycamore is a Community Pub (also runs the shop) that had received the national award of

Community Pub of the Year. Chairman had a copy of template letter for potential new members. It was agreed these could be circulated around pubs covered by the Branch. **Action: MG. Pub Survey and Pub of the Year** Branch recommendations to be made to Derby Branch/CAMRA HQ by end of January. Chairman suggested the Branch draw up a shortlist of 6 and identify an Ashbourne pub and a Country pub. Certificates produced by CAMRA and the Branch could arrange 'Award Ceremonies'. Members to make recommendations for the shortlist to Chairman over the next few weeks (from the list of pubs within the Branch area) with a debate and selection session to be part of the social event at the Smiths on 27 December. **Beer Festival** Town Hall confirmed, 22-24 March. Town Council staff had been very helpful in the planning discussions. Both main rooms at Town Hall required. Booking form to be submitted. **Action: PL.** Festival Chairman, D Leigh, reported the following: Festival Name – working with Shrovetide football – discussions on-going with Shrovetide Committee. Some members queried direct association with football. Already a high level of interest in the Festival. Business plan was with CAMRA. A Festival website – Ashbourne Beer Festival - had been sponsored by broadband.co.uk whose owners were Ashbourne residents. This was a publicity vehicle for the festival and would not be used for the Planning Committee. Some registrations of interest in attending had been made. Approaches had been made to Dale Ales and Peakstone Brewery for support with supply of beers. Both interested and could support and take responsibility set-up etc. There was also interest from a new Welsh Brewery. Marston's to be approached. Some members felt that there should be mainstream beers available as well as new and local products. DL would base the mix on CAMRA experience and advise. Branch member David Coackley would provide H&S advice. A logo was required. Tony will approach Reg, a brilliant illustrator with Derby CAMRA. **Action: Tony** Support with publicity and marketing was required. The Chairman is in discussion with Radio Ashbourne – this appeared to be a no charge arrangement but to be confirmed. **Action: MG.** BBC Radio Derby was suggested. Sponsorship for the Festival glasses sought from local pubs and businesses – could become collectors' items and also for sponsors for the beers – suggested cost of £80 per beer. Decisions were required on entertainment. Approaches had been made by local musicians. Chairman had heard from Pete Brown a well-known writer on real ales that he would attend the Festival. Festival

Planning meetings fortnightly. First mtg at the Smiths Tavern on **Tuesday 11 December**. Members asked to commit time to planning. Documentation for Festival being prepared by chairman and will be available at the first planning mtg. **Action: MG. Pub Report** Green Man had been purchased. The Dog & Partridge at Thorpe is closed. No further news on the Shire Horse at Wyaston but expected to reopen shortly.
