Winter Fest Comes Around Again

The 12th Derby CAMRA Winter Beer Festival will run from **Wednesday 20th to Saturday 23rd February** at The Roundhouse, Derby College, Pride Park, and with over 300 real ales, ciders, perries, continental beers and mead, all tastes are catered for. The Mayor will open the festival at 430pm on Wednesday and Trent Barton is providing free shuttle buses from the Market Place and bus station every 20 minutes. All twelve Derby breweries will feature including the newest, Shiny, which will have a bespoke brewery bar, as will Derventio from Darley Abbey. A marquee will host the bands, with Killerz headlining on Saturday night, and the cover band will doubtless be performing some of the great songs from last year's blockbuster album, Battle Born. Catering will include the cheesemonger and the chocolatier, Merry Berry, will again be present. Card carrying CAMRA members enjoy free admission, except after 5pm on Friday and Saturday when 50% is charged.

Volunteer staff are required from 2pm, Friday 15th February when set up begins at The Roundhouse, and by volunteering for the Festival you should have lots of fun and enjoy being there. Pre-registered volunteers will receive a complimentary t-shirt sponsored by Dancing Duck Brewery, so don't delay, **send the staffing form today**. Exciting news reaches us that the Derbyshire CAMRA Club of the Year, The Nunsfield, in Alvaston, is through to the nation's last four clubs, with a final decision due in May.

Exeter Bounces Back

The Good Beer Guide describes the **Exeter Arms** as "truly iconic" and for once this term is fully merited as one of Derby's best loved pubs celebrates the capture of the Derby CAMRA Pub of the Year title. It isn't long ago that this characterful side street tavern was down on its luck but since the intervention of Derby's Dancing Duck brewery and new licensees Martin Roper and Denise Sage, the "Ex" has really taken off. High quality beer is only part of the story, with the Secret Dining Co earning rave reviews for its innovative culinary offerings. Martin's musical bent is evident in a vibrant music scene which sees musicians performing on Wednesday and Saturday evenings. A quiz, set by a renowned former Editor of Derby Drinker, has proved popular on Monday nights, and the Cottage next door is an imaginative addition to a pub bristling with traditional features. Deemed unviable by its previous owners, the **Furnace** in Duke Street has enjoyed a meteoric rise to prominence after being judged runner-up in the city. Owner, Pedro Menon, an old head on young shoulders, has been rewarded for his meticulous presentation of beers, some of which are rare to these parts. The Shiny brewery to the rear is Derby's newest plant, and its beers will be showcased on a bespoke Shiny brewery bar at the Roundhouse festival this month.

Oak Worthy of its Royal Billing

The diminution of the Derby branch area by the creation of the Ashbourne and Amber Valley branches has significantly reduced the number of our rural pubs. This should not, however, take the gloss off the Country Pub of the Year accolade, which once again went to the venerable **Royal Oak** at Ockbrook. The virtues of this superb, village local hardly need reiterating but suffice to say that Steve Hornbuckle and the family continue to serve cracking beer in a pleasing environment. The **Pattenmakers Arms** was runner-up in the country category, and the attractive, Edwardian pub is a popular haunt for many of Duffield's discerning drinkers. **Overall winner**, the Exeter, now goes through to the Derbyshire Pub of the Year stage.

Derby Brewery Wins National Award

Elland Brewery 1872 Porter (6.5%abv) has been crowned Champion Winter Beer of Britain at the recent National Winter Ales Festival in Manchester. Derby Brewing Company's Penny's Porter earned a creditable bronze in the Porter category.

The International Festival of Beer

The National Brewery Centre, Horninglow Street, Burton, will stage the International Festival of Beer from Friday, 15th to Sunday, 17th February, and it promises to be quite an event with 800 beers and ciders from 40 countries. There will be live music across the weekend and admission is £3 per person for daytime sessions, and £5 per person for evenings.

Mick Chambers

The sad news has reached us of long time CAMRA member Mick Chambers' death at his Belper home. Mick, 60, was educated at Herbert Strutt's Grammar School in Belper, and was one of the unsung heroes of the City Charter Festival, working as a steward for nigh on 30 years. A true friend to Derby CAMRA, Mick will be missed by all who knew him.

Keith Normington

More sad news has just reached us of the death on Jan 29th of Keith Normington. He was a long-standing Derby CAMRA branch supporter, probably a founder member, as well as branch and festival treasurer, auditor, etc. His Funeral is at 6 pm on Feb 12th at St Philips, Chaddesden and the cremation is on Feb 13th after an 11.30am service at the church. Keith had been ill for some time but was until even last year the branch account auditor and his services will be sorely missed.

New Brush Sweeps Clean

Better days lie ahead for The Abbey in Darley Abbey, after Lee Jackson and CAMRA member, Sally Orgill took over the village pub before Christmas. Lee, whose catering background helped to restore the fortunes of two Nuneaton pubs, and Sally, intend to make a number of improvements including all day opening from 1st April. At long last the wonderful Undercroft bar will re-open with new furniture and an enticing new food menu will be introduced. This will all take a little time but the portents are promising for The Abbey.

NBSS (National Beer Scoring Scheme)

Stewart Marshall, Derby CAMRA GBG Coordinator, would like to draw your attention to the following:-

beerscoring.org.uk

The beer scoring web site home page has changed to take you to whatpub.com and invites you to start scoring via WhatPub. You may find this site easier but if you

want to use the beer scoring web site to edit or delete scores you have already submitted, use the 'No thanks, take me to the old version' link under the 'Start Scoring' button.

The Scores

The bottom end of the scoring range has changed recently to differentiate between 'no real ale' and 'undrinkable':

- 0.0 – no real ale
- 0.5 – undrinkable
- 1.0 – poor
- 2.0 – average
- 3.0 – good
- 4.0 – very good
- 5.0 – perfect
- * - half points allowed

Undrinkable

Before scoring your beer as 'undrinkable', always ask for a replacement and score that. If no replacement is offered then score 0.5

Perfect

We all need to calibrate our scoring to the same level so that scores can be compared. The primary factor in scoring is beer quality, not whether we like the style of beer. The most important point on the scale is 2.0 – 'average', ordinary run of the mill beer quality. All beers should be judged against this standard: get this level right and the other scores should fall into place. Unfortunately, the prominence of 5.0 – 'perfect' is starting to become more common. A score of 5.0 should be awarded rarely. If you do find yourself doing it, stop and pinch yourself to check to see whether you have died and gone to heaven. Some seasoned beer scorers have never scored a 5.0.

Finding Bass

Some have reported difficulty in finding Bass in the beer scoring system. On the old beer scoring web site just type 'dr' into the brewery field and Draught Bass will appear in the list. On the new WhatPub web site just type 'drau' into the beer field and Draught Bass will appear in the list.

Finding the Brewery Tap

Another scoring difficulty is finding the Brewery Tap. Just type 'brewery tap –' (brewery tap<space><hyphen>) into the pub field and it will appear in the list.

Beer Not Found

Virtually every brewery is in the beer scoring system but not every beer. If your beer is not in the list, on the beer scoring web site choose '—other—' and enter your beer name in the comment field. On the WhatPub web site just type the beer name into the beer field.

CAMRA Launch What Pub

CAMRA has launched a new, national pub site which you can review and update yourself. Visit whatpub.com and log in with either the same details you use to visit the members' area of CAMRA's national website or, if you have not visited the Members' area of CAMRA's national website before, try your CAMRA membership number and postcode when

you joined the campaign (upper case, no space).
