Ashbourne Beer Festival

The Victorian splendour of Ashbourne Town Hall, opposite the Market Place, is the setting for the first Ashbourne and District CAMRA beer festival between Friday, 22nd and Sunday, 24th March. The sub-branch was founded only twelve months ago, therefore it's a considerable achievement to organize a festival so quickly. There will be approximately 25 real ales with the emphasis on local provenance i.e. mostly sourced from within a 30 mile radius of Ashbourne, with the strongest being Ripley brewed Amber Imperial IPA, 6.5% abv. Wales is likely to be represented by Brecon brewery, though this has to be confirmed. Traditional cider and perry lovers are catered for with 7 varieties, and proceedings will be enlivened by Bill Bailey's Jazz Band and Murphy's Marbles, together with some local musicians. Third pint measures may be consumed and children are welcome, accompanied by adults, with the proviso that children leave by 6pm. The festival, where beer will be bought with tokens, not cash, is open from 1pm, Friday to 11pm. On Saturday, noon to 11pm, and Sunday (subject to beer supplies) noon to 3pm. Admission is £2 at all times but free to card carrying CAMRA members, and **should you wish to work at the festival please contact Mark Grist m.grist2@sky.com** A decent bus service exists between Derby and Ashbourne.

Roundhouse Festival Still on the Right Track

The 3rd Roundhouse festival was well received by 9,000 or so punters with a good selection of brews still available on Saturday evening. Grainstore brewery of Oakham was top of the hops with a remarkable hat-trick of victories in the judging of East Midlands' beers. Grainstore's winners and Bateman's Salem Porter which topped the Porter category are now in the running for the Champion Winter Beer of Britain final 2014. Grainstore Nip was judged the best in the Barley Wine/Strong Ale section whilst Grainstore Rutland Beast was best in the Old Ale/Strong Mild category. Overall winner was Grainstore Ratcliffe Stout, 4.3% abv, which is very similar to Dancing Duck's superb Dark Drake. 135 new members were recruited, almost certainly a record for the winter festival, and comparable in number to the City Charter Festivals. A monumental effort was required to stage this rapidly expanding event and all of the many volunteers deserve a huge pat on the back. There is a **festival review meeting** at the **Brunswick** function room on **Tuesday, 19th March**, starting at 8pm, and a cracking brewery visit for festival volunteers is detailed on page 4.

Annual Beer Census

Thanks to all of you who turned out on 1st February to collate the information which confirmed Derby's status amongst the nation's top beer destinations. All in all, 276 beers were recorded, of which 180 were different (176 last year), available in 68 pubs with an average price £2.87 a pint.

NBSS (National Beer Scoring Scheme)

Stewart Marshall, Derby CAMRA GBG Coordinator, would like to draw your attention to some information regarding beerscoring.org.uk

The Scores

The bottom end of the scoring range has changed recently to differentiate between 'no real ale' and 'undrinkable':

- 0.0 – no real ale
- 0.5 – undrinkable
- 1.0 – poor
- 2.0 – average
- 3.0 – good
- 4.0 – very good
- 5.0 – perfect
- * - half points allowed

Undrinkable

Before scoring your beer as 'undrinkable', always ask for a replacement and score that. If no replacement is offered then score 0.5

Perfect

We all need to calibrate our scoring to the same level so that scores can be compared. The primary factor in scoring is beer quality, not whether we like the style of beer. The most important point on the scale is 2.0 – 'average', ordinary run of the mill beer quality. All beers should be judged against this standard: get this level right and the other scores should fall into place. Unfortunately, the prominence of 5.0 – 'perfect' is starting to become more common. A score of 5.0 should be awarded rarely. If you do find yourself doing it, stop and pinch yourself to check to see whether you have died and gone to heaven. Some seasoned beer scorers have never scored a 5.0.

Finding Bass

Some have reported difficulty in finding Bass in the beer scoring system. Just type 'dr' into the brewery field and Draught Bass will appear in the list.

Finding the Brewery Tap

Another scoring difficulty is finding the Brewery Tap. Just type 'brewery tap –' (brewery tap<space><hyphen>) into the pub field and it will appear in the list.

Beer Not Found

Virtually every brewery is in the beer scoring system but not every beer. If your beer is not in the list, choose '—other—' and enter your beer name in the comment field.

CAMRA Launch What Pub

Meeting held at the Thomas

Leaper on 13th February

Apologies. Ian Forman, Konrad Machej, Steve Crispin. **Minutes of last meeting.** Approved. **Matters Arising.** None.

OFFICERS' reports. **Chair.** Firstly the sad news of the death of two Branch Stalwarts, Mick Chambers and Keith Normington. Mick was a regular worker at both Beer Festivals where he would often steward, while Keith had held many posts within the Branch inc Branch & Beer Festival Treasurer, Branch Auditor and he also worked at almost every Beer Festival that the Branch had run. He was a member from the very early days of the Branch.

Both Tim Williams and Jok Arguile spoke about Keith's contribution to the Branch. It was noted that he had run raffles that sustained the branch financially in the early days, and had been the lifeblood of the Branch. Nationally we had just had the National Winter Ales Fest which comes to Derby next year. The Members' weekend in Norwich is 19th-21st April, pre-registration is open. The Branch has tabled a motion for consideration about the recent interference in the Winter-Fest budget. Community pubs month is in April. We are being advised to keep up the pressure on our local MP's about the duty escalator ahead of the budget. Locally the Derby Winter-Fest is only a week away. The ABC crawl was held at the start of the month with approx 180 different ales, up on last year. Our Pubs of the Year have been selected and thanks go to the 17 Judges that took part this year. Presentations will take place at the Winter-Fest. Our own AGM is on 11th April, any volunteers for the Committee to let the Secretary know before the AGM. There were still a few Branch vacancies as per M&B. **Secretary.** Not present. **Treasurer.** Accounts should be ready for next Committee Meeting. Derby Drinker Admonies still need to be reined in. **Summer Festival.** Budget approval detained until audit is complete. Theme is John Whitehurst - Festival of time. We are getting good support from Assembly Rooms, who are applying for a licence. Computer image of proposed marquee available from Russell. Changes of catering, Kudos taken over by Assembly Rooms. Great Hall, dressing rooms and behind stage not available. Entertainment on main stage transfers to marquee. Fire limit similar. Main entrance is opposite quad. Advance bookings probably enter via Darwin. **Campaigning.** Mild Month - Steve Crispin contacting licensees at trade session, plus AV participation. Pub map - Next M&B will contain a list of pub photos that are still required. Out of town surveys - A modest improvement but something to build on. **Derby Drinker.** Thanks to Terry Morton for early distribution of DDs in town. Late arrival of Festival material and Steve Webster's last DD contributed to lateness, ie issue was released near to Festival date. Future of DD - we have had some response from the Ad in DD for a new designer. The Printers turnaround was much better with 2nd new printer based in Wiltshire, and much cheaper than Colourstream. **Good Beer Guide & Surveys.** GBG selections made-see Stewart for details. NBSS - going to old site will allow edit of old scores. Stewart will assist with problems that include finding obscure pubs and brewery taps. No info on survey trips. Stewart will review Mild+Bitter entries. **Locale+CAMRA discount.** Both schemes going well. **Membership.** Konrad reported the following regarding membership: 34 new members, 2 transferred into Branch, 1 transferred out of Branch. There are no

reports of lapsed members this month. This is because HQ is cleaning the records - getting rid of duplicates, out-of-date information, etc. Lapsed members records have to be extracted from this, and so will be reported next month. Konrad intends to write to new and transferred-in members towards the end of the month. Our total membership stands at 2184, of which 45 are under-26. These figures do not include Ashbourne & District. Nationally, we are 25 short of 147,000 members - so recruit a mate today! **Mild + Bitter.** Deadline is Wed 27 Feb. Castle and Falcon to reopen ? Robin reopened with real ale, licensee from Sheffield area. Change of lic Honeycomb. Graham Yates - concern over fate of brewery as he retires end March. Suggest recognition of Graham on retirement. His non CAMRA leaving event march 30. **Winter Festival.** (Gill apologized for late arrival). Festival Workers event...Dancing Duck tour and drinks in New Zealand 26th April. Festival set-up starts Friday 2pm. Fri - 9 and Saturday morning cooling training. 40 coolers being sent from HQ. Tokens £1.00 on stalls and outside festival where permitted. 2 food vouchers for full day.

Chairman: Reminded all of the Marchington Beer Festival March 8-9. Contact had been made with Dancing Duck brewery who agreed to a branch visit as part of the thank-you offered to festival workers. This will be in late April/early May – to be confirmed once we have an idea of numbers interested as space is limited to about 20. Made members aware of the Chester Green Ale Trail in Derby and suggested a social based on the circuit of six pubs in the scheme, using either the Swift bus service or an ACT vehicle if available. Circular from HQ on suggestions for different pub awards to be considered. A CAMRA leaflet is available to be dropped in pubs concerning Pubs Campaigns for 2013. **Pub reports:** New owner of Green Man now public knowledge, but plans are still sketchy. Nag's Head, Hulland Ward – now re-opened after refurbishment. Coach & Horses – For Sale signs still up, infrequent opening seems to be a policy of daytime opening only for food sales, closes at 6pm because "no-one about". White Hart closed indefinitely. The Ketch – patchy opening and still very uncertain, despite new regime. The Horns – outside décor very shabby and unloved – doesn't fit in with rest of square. Dog & Partridge, Thorpe – delayed re-opening. Station Hotel – although closed to public for bar sales, the lease is for sale. A new owner may want to return to open sales and real ale? Information not discussed at meeting, but in public domain – the regime at the George & Dragon may be coming to an end. It was agreed by all that almost all of the above does not paint a very rosy picture of pub life in the town at the moment. Hopefully, the spring/summer will see an upturn in the fortunes of many of the pubs discussed. **Pub of the Year Presentations.** Framed certificates were presented by the Chairman to Andrew (The Cock, Clifton) and to Dave & Michelle (The Smith's Tavern) for their achievements in the competition. **AOB** Tony Beech reported that he is perennially unable to speak to Heywood (Callow Top) brewery and obtaining up to date information is almost impossible. **Beer festival** – Marston's were confirmed as having NO involvement despite months of repeated contacts and promises to return calls/e-mails. Dave had therefore ordered the glasses, which will feature just our festival logo and the CAMRA tankard. The beer order had been confirmed with Duke's Ales, as well as the 3 independent suppliers. Still an issue with cooling – Dave discussing with Paul Duke and a potential supplier from Peakstones Ales, and David Coackley also suggested

another name that we could approach. Music bill almost finalised as Mick Doyle had agreed to take a slot for a reduced fee – although still more than originally agreed. Catering requirements can be met as specified – the question of a fridge is still to be addressed, although it is believed that existing kitchen on site may cover all needs. **Meeting closed at 9.25pm.**
