## John Whitehurst

John Whitehurst will be the theme of this year's Summer Beer Festival - Why is this distinguished clockmaker worthy of such recognition in Derby today? Next time you pass the Cathedral, just look up at the clock, a piece of Whitehurst's handiwork still marking time with its quarterly chimes over 260 years after its construction. However, making elegant and durable clock mechanisms was merely one part of his worthy achievements. Whitehurst had an interest in "mechanics, pneumatics and hydraulics", designing water pumps, plumbing and heating systems. He was appointed the national official "stamper of money-weights" in 1775. He was also an eminent geologist, writing "An Inquiry into the Original State and Formation of the Earth" in 1778, with exquisitely produced geological diagrams. Whitehurst was a member of the Lunar Society, a renowned club of enlightenment thinkers meeting in Birmingham, by the light of the full moon to aid travelling at night. In fact, he was an all-rounder with an amazing string of achievements to his name, and well worth celebrating in the way we know best – a pint of good beer!

## London Drinker Festival

A BLOT team (Beer Lovers On Tour) from the senior ranks of Derby CAMRA travelled down to London in March to attend the London Drinker Trade session. The festival is conveniently situated in the Camden Centre, ten minutes walk from St Pancras Station. The trade session is timed for two hours between the morning and evening session and was an excellent opportunity to sample many of the new and established London beers, which are often difficult to find in The East Midlands. An added bonus was the presence of many of the brewers and we took the opportunity to chat to a number of them. There were fifteen brewers supplying their wares at this session and one cider maker. We enjoyed tasting beers from Brewers such as: Sambrooks, Clarence and Fredericks, Crate, The Cronx, Redemption, London Fields, and Windsor and Eton. The brewers were young, friendly and enthusiastic and keen to hear about our Derby festivals, perhaps our local brewers should consider a trip here to network with their London counterparts. Pedro at the Furnace already has links with the boys from The Cronx, a mixture of Croydon and the Bronx, enabling us to taste some of their brews at the Winter Festival. Overall, a stimulating experience and a lesson in how to organise a good Trade Session; only beers donated by brewers on offer, hence minimal staffing and no tills. Plenty of time to meet brewers and taste beers not often encountered. At its very convenient location this festival should attract more visitors than it does from our area. Give it a try.

**Minutes of last meeting** Accepted as a true record except that Kevin Hepworth had audited Amber Valley, not Summer Festival accounts. **Matters arising** Gwen Sandhu reported that trees for the cider orchard were bought from funds collected.

**Chairman's report** – As published in M&B. **Finance** - Treasurer's report, branch and beer festival accounts, Auditors' report - The Treasurer reported that the last Branch Committee meeting had reviewed the draft accounts discussed at the March Branch Meeting and it is considered necessary to make some changes to the accounts. These changes are not yet complete and the accounts will be brought for approval to an EGM, together with auditors' reports – probably in June or July. **Appointment of new Auditors** In view of the above the Committee decided to defer the

appointment of auditors to the AGM.

**Motions for debate.** None.

**Election of new committee** The following seven nominations had been proposed and seconded and all are appointed. Chair - Gareth Stead, Treasurer - Julian Tubbs, Secretary - Ian Forman, Membership - Konrad Machej, Ralf Edge, Anna Dyson, Stephen Crispin. **Branch Awards** The Chairman announced that awards were to be made to Phil and Christine Hall for their contribution especially at the beer festivals. As they were not present a special presentation event will be arranged. **Any other business** Praise from the floor for the Winter Festival came from a Nottingham Branch Member. Trent Barton Club 55 – Free membership.

## Minutes of the Derby CAMRA Extraordinary General Meeting at the Crown & Cushion, Derby, on 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2012

**Present** Gareth Stead (GS, Chair), Konrad Machej (KM, Minuting), Julian Tubbs (JT, Treasurer) and 24 other members (at start). **Adoption of Accounts** JT presented the accounts for the Derby Winter Beer Festival 2011, Derby City Charter (Summer) Beer Festival 2011, Amber Valley Beer Festival 2011 and Derby Branch 2011. He apologised for the delay in presentation, due partly to complications over VAT registration. HMRC has agreed that VAT should be paid at 6.5%. Jok Arguile (JA) questioned whether stock values had been included. He commended Amber Valley on organising its own festival and noted that the Branch with its Sub-branches were

close to exceeding the small business rate. Les Baynton (LB) asked why the performing rights at the Winter Festival appeared to be more expensive than the Summer Festival, and it was believed the cause was owing to the different practices between the Roundhouse and the Assembly Rooms in accounting for the cost. JT expressed gratitude for the auditing done by Keith Normington. (It was noted with regret that Keith is not well, and members were invited to sign a Get Well Soon card.) Russ Gilbert (RG) reported that the Summer Festival loan has been repaid, and VAT has also been paid. Paul Gibson (PG), Amber Valley Festival Treasurer, gave a brief report on the sub-branch's Beer Festival, observing that profit rose by 54% on the previous year. JA requested written reports from the Treasurers of the Winter and Summer Festivals, and from the Auditor. GS proposed acceptance of all the accounts, and this was **carried** by 9 votes to **Appointment of Auditors** JA volunteered to audit the Summer Beer Festival 2012 and Amber Valley Beer Festival 2012 accounts - **agreed** JT thought he could find a volunteer to audit the Winter Beer Festival 2012 and Branch 2012 accounts - **action JT**.

## Minutes of the Amber Valley CAMRA Branch Meeting at the Black Bulls Head, Openwoodgate, on 28<sup>th</sup> February, 2013

Meeting started at 8.15pm with 10 attendees. **Apologies** Trevor Spencer, Paul Falconer, Mick Wallis, Anne Kennedy, Mark Little, Karen Guest. **Minutes of last meeting** Accepted as a true record.

**Officers' Reports - Chairman** – Chris confirmed that all future branch meetings would start at 8pm. On alternate months (the next one being in March) there will be a short Committee meeting at 8pm prior to the Branch Meeting but all members are welcome to attend. Regional Meeting on 2<sup>nd</sup> March which Chris will attend.

Regional Director informed the Branch that we should aim for 3 Campaigning Goals during year. After discussion, Branch objectives identified as 1) to develop a new website and newsletter independent of the Derby branch website. 2) to organise the first Amber Valley Cider Trail in October and 3) to organise a second Winter Ale Trail. Branch invited to judge pubs shortlisted for the East Midlands Cider Pub of the Year. There will be 6-8 pubs covering the East Midlands and Chris volunteered as judge but others invited as well. **Secretary** – Trevor not present but an SGM would precede the April branch meeting to appoint Auditors. **Treasurer** – Paul not present. **Membership Secretary** – Phil confirmed 8 new members, 2 transferred in from other branches and 5 transferred out. Recruitment of new members at the Derby festival was very successful, and some will be AV members. **Social Secretary** – Jane circulated copies of her report. Trevor had confirmed a pub crawl of Nottingham on 9<sup>th</sup> March. **Pubs Officer** – Nigel had nothing to report. **Beer Festival Report** – Budget approved. All bands booked. Flyers are available for distribution. The Festival logo has not been agreed - decision at next Beer Festival Meeting. A volunteer to act as Health and Safety Officer is still required as a matter of urgency – this will be a much easier task this year owing to change of venue. **Amber Valley Pub of the Year** – Chris confirmed that the Black Bulls Head presentation on 24<sup>th</sup> February coincided with 1<sup>st</sup> anniversary of the pub's re-opening. Presentation to runner-up, The Old Oak, on 1<sup>st</sup> March. The Black Bulls Head will go forward as Branch's nomination for Derbyshire Pub of the Year. The Branch will be invited to judge the shortlist of eight pubs and discussion was held as to whether this will be feasible, i.e. whether enough people would be interested and how much it would cost for transport. Chris to find out how Derby branch carry out their judging and if a joint trip is possible. **GBG Selection Meeting** – Was very well attended. A larger venue

will be booked for next year's meeting. 10 Amber Valley pubs chosen for the 2014 Good Beer Guide. **Amber Trails** – The **Winter Ale Trail** had proved to be very popular and successful and thanks go to Trevor for coming up with the idea and organising it. The Holly Bush at Makeney won, the Black Boy at Heage came 2<sup>nd</sup> and the New Inn at Riddings came 3<sup>rd</sup>. Certificates have been presented to all three winning pubs. We intend to run the Trail again next winter. Information regarding the **Mild Trails** during May will be circulated in due course. The first **Amber Valley Cider Trail** will take place from 1<sup>st</sup> October to 3<sup>rd</sup> November. Pubs should commit to serving at least one real cider for the duration of the Trail and to display any pump clips, posters etc advertising the event. The Branch will put together a list of pubs interested in taking part and circulate details of the event nearer the time. **Information Exchange** - Phil confirmed that the website has been updated this week and he will be sending out the e-mail newsletter in the next few days. If anyone has information that they would like Phil to include in the newsletter each month regarding beer festivals etc, please let him know before the end of the month so that he can include them in the next newsletter. The earlier he has this information the better. Andy confirmed that the Lord Nelson in Belper is up for auction on 7<sup>th</sup> March and that the Hop Inn has new tenants, Jamie and Amy, who intend to continue serving a good selection of real ales, to begin serving food and also to offer rooms for B&B. **Forthcoming Meetings** Monday 18<sup>th</sup> March – Beer Festival Meeting at the Grapes, Belper at 8pm.
