AGM Motion for Debate

Great Music and Ale at the Groom

Those who like their music and real ale who haven't already frequented the Horse and Groom, on Elms Street, off Kedleston Road, should consider paying the street corner local a visit, particularly on a Saturday night. 2013 Good Beer Guide listed, and one of only four Derby pubs in the first Good Beer Guide in'74, the former Bass house bears little resemblance to its original self, having been extended into the house next-door. And the Draught Bass has been augmented by three wellkept guest beers. Stafford based .44 pistol recently kicked up a storm with a stirring rhythm and blues set that featured some great harmonica playing. All beers, regardless of strength, are £2.90, and the live music is.....free!

Crisp New Look for Slug and Lettuce

The Slug and Lettuce, Iron Gate, has been refurbished in contemporary style with an outside drinking area to the rear which looks like it'll catch the summer sun. The 10% CAMRA discount, the most generous in Derby, has been retained as have the handpumps with Greene King IPA and two LocAles vying for attention. In a previous incarnation, in the late 60s and 70s, this was one of Derby's most popular venues when it was one of two Berni Inn steak houses and known as the Iron Gates Tayern

Effort in Testing Circumstances

Many thanks for all the support you showed us. We ran the festival on all three days and it was still a success in its own right as an event, if you discount the financial shortfall we inevitably suffered owing to the appalling conditions. A lot of locals came in, but it was the travelling numbers we fell chronically short of. We got a few individual Derby members through the door, but many of them couldn't make it en masse and a minibus from Stoke abandoned their visit. I'd like to thank those members who came to help, particularly Steve Cook from Amber Valley. In simple terms, we budgeted for 1300-1400 through the door and got approx. 240 on Friday, around 400 on Saturday and almost 100 on Sunday, which actually pushed the end of the drink-up session from 3pm onto 5pm, as so many wanted to stay on at £2 a pint and we were desperate for every penny! Overall, that gave us about half the attendance we needed. We sold half the beer, used half the programmes and sold a quarter of the glasses, so that all means we were exactly on track if you take the inclement weather out of the equation. It was gratifying to receive so many positive comments and frequent requests for a repeat (not of the weather!) next year. We will be back although we may move the date further into the year, which I know is still no guarantee of kinder weather, but you never know! All Matters Arising were covered by the Agenda. First Ashbourne CAMRA Beer Festival A formal 'wash-up' meeting was planned for Tuesday 9 April. There was a short discussion covering the main points: Although the Festival had been hit by bad weather members agreed that the event had been a success. Good feedback had been received from all who attended. On the basis of the footfall achieved it was agreed that the business plan had been realistic. Further consideration had to be given to the venue. Although the central location of the Town Hall was of great benefit, the H&S issues related to the building had made it difficult to service and manage. The limitation on numbers was a particular concern. The timing of the event may need further discussion. More local marketing, e.g. banners and signage around market square and clearer indication of opening times was need for future events. The Chairman asked that a formal vote of thanks should be given to all volunteers, especially those who had travelled into Ashbourne to support the event. A 'thank you' event was planned for May (17 or 24 – date to be confirmed) when a visit to the Dancing Duck brewery and pubs in the vicinity was being organised. All volunteers would be invited. Members thanked the Chairman and Festival organiser for their efforts considered to be beyond the call of duty during the run up to the Festival and the event itself. Annual General Meeting The next meeting of the Branch -30 April at The Shire Horse, Wyaston - will be the Branch AGM. This will be a formal meeting and members attending will need to bring membership cards. Branch Officers will need to be elected.
