It was agreed that the meeting would be conducted over three sites: Bowling Green: Apologies Gareth Butterfield, Lizzie Butterfield, Diane Grist, Malcolm Philippe, John Kippax, Michelle Leigh. Minutes of September Meeting/Matters Arising The Minutes had been circulated and were approved. No matters arising which were not covered by the Agenda. Officials' reports: Chairman Members discussed a CAMRA report on proposals to implement a late night levy for those pubs and bars that

operate late night serving (after midnight). The fees to be charged will be based on rateable values. The What Pub website now available. This is open access for CAMRA members. Treasurer's Report The invoice for the Beer Festival volunteers' trip to the Dancing Duck Brewery is still outstanding. DL will pay this from Festival funds. Secretary's Report CAMRA has notified the Branch of another new member. The full list of Branch members has still not been received. Branch Activity A further Branch walk - a nine mile route taking is some of the Staffordshire Moorlands pubs - would take place on 29 september 2013. Branch members had been notified. A second route from Kniveton would be confirmed for a later date. PL reported that notification to the press had to be given by the Friday of the week preceding the event with publication on the following Wednesday. The Horns: Pub Report We visited the Horns for part of our meeting in recognition that it changed hands last week. The new licensees are known personally to some of our group, so it is hoped that we can work together to raise the profile of the pub. Members gave the following reports: The lease on the Olde Vaults is still available, with little sign of any activity. The pub closes every Monday & Tuesday night due to lack of trade. A discussion was held over the re-opening of the Coach & Horses. Whilst all agreed the refit had produced a pleasant environment, there is still work to do with regards to the general operation and the disappointing beer selection. It was, however, agreed that the branch should show support for the new venture by holding our November meeting there. The White Hart has reopened - again - but it is not expected to remain open for any length of time as they do not seem to be able to install staff of any quality. The Red Lion at Kniveton has taken out London Pride and replaced it with Black Sheep. The Dog & Partridge at Thorpe is now expected to open Easter 2014. In talks with a local member, the owner has indicated that he wishes to run it as a pub/cafe operation rather than a pub restaurant business. The Green Man has had almost all the scaffolding removed from the frontage and roof and the clothing shop is expected to open in the first week of October, after which all our attention will switch to phase 2 and the hopes for a new pub area in the courtyard development. Despite failing to sell at auction in July and then subsequently closing altogether, the Yew Tree at Ednaston is reported to have some interest from a new purchaser. Nothing firm to report, but we will continue to monitor it. **Smith's Tavern: Any Other Business** Richard Bright gave us a short report on the Atlow Village Beer Festival, which was supported by several branch members. It was a great success, despite the apparent misgivings of some local residents, and the branch congratulated him on the

organisation and success of the event. In

turn, Richard thanked the branch both for the advice offered before the event and for the attendance of those members. A general discussion was held about increasing the profile of the branch. One suggestion was to approach the local weekly paper to see if they would be interested in giving us a small amount of space every month to publicise our activities and offer information on local pub activities e.g. the supplying of new or unusual beers by the local pubs. As one of our members is a reporter on the paper, this was felt to be something that could be done, so this will be followed up by the Chairman. Kevin Woolley reported that he had set up a Twitter account for the branch, so that we could also circulate information via that medium. Copies of the new Good Beer Guide were made available for purchase by members and several copies were sold. The current remaining stock has been left at the Smith's Tavern, available for purchase from there if required. The general consensus on the multi-venue meeting was favourable - we may look at a different set of pubs in the town for a future meeting.
