### Minutes of the Ashbourne Sub-Branch of CAMRA Branch Meeting at The Ketch, Kniveton on 29th October 2013

**Present:** Mark Grist, Diane Grist, Dave Leigh, Michelle Leigh, Kevin Woolley, Hannah Barton, Gareth Butterfield, Richard Bright, Malcolm Philippe, Kim Dorrington, Barry Wright. **Apologies:** Pat Laughlin, Keith Palmer, David Coackley, Tony Beech, Lizzie Butterfield. **Minutes of the last meeting/matters arising** The Minutes had been circulated and were approved. No matters were arising. **Chairman's Report** The chairman welcomed the group to the venue and it was noted that, although not on tap this evening, the management have personal links with the Bumpmill Brewery and usually feature their beers at the weekend. The chairman was pleased to report to the group that some postcode areas have been allocated to us by the Derby branch committee following detailed discussions and the exercise of canvassing opinion from those in the proposed areas. It was noted that a very small response had been received by the Derby branch and, as such, it was taken that a lack of dissenting views meant that it would not be seen to be a problem to re-align the areas proposed. This has been ratified by the Derby committee, and although final approval still needs to be given by the regional director and from CAMRA HQ, it can realistically be taken as read. Therefore, the chairman was able to give members details of the villages and areas now on our watch, to include Brailsford, Hulland Ward, Longford, Shirley, Hollington, Trusley, Stanton on the Hill, Dalbury Lees, Boylestone, Doveridge and Sudbury. In turn, this also provides us with a list of 11 pubs (not including any currently closed) to visit and review and which can now be regarded as eligible for our POTY competition. The revised complete list will be circulated with the minutes to all members. **Secretary** The secretary was unable to attend due to work commitments, but indicated that there are no essential matters to be raised for this meeting. **Branch Activity** A short discussion was held regarding surveys for the pubs newly added to our area and Richard Bright proposed that we get a least one minibus trip arranged to cover a few of them in the very near future. This was agreed and arrangements will be made through Pat/Keith and ACT. A discussion was also held to look at the next pub ramble. It was suggested that we try to get one organised for early December and to keep it shorter than our previous two walks. One area suggested was the Kniveton/Hognaston region, which will be looked at in some depth. **Pub of the Year** The format for the POTY competition was

discussed and members agreed on a single winner this year rather than a separate town and country category leading to an overall winner, but that we would also award a "Most Improved" to the pub we felt had taken the biggest steps forward in the last 12 months. Verbal nominations were given for several pubs that would fit this criteria and will be added to the official lists to be circulated at the November meeting. The proposed timetable is for nominations by the November meeting, shortlists decided by the December meeting, judging and voting throughout January and results at the January meeting. **Pub Reports** Gareth Butterfield addressed the meeting with details he had been passed in his work capacity for the next development stage for the Green Man, which were due to be in the local paper the next day. There will be a further development of retail units in the courtyard and a brasserie is to be added to the rear of the Young Ideas shop, but most pertinently for us, a cellar pub is proposed for the area formerly occupied by Leatherbritches Brewery. It is not yet known who will run it or exactly what form it will be take, but this can only be viewed as a positive step to retain beer-drinking at the Green Man. The Roston Inn (The Shant) has surprisingly re-opened after a four month closure, albeit Thursday to Sunday only at present. There is apparently a covenant on the pub and two adjoining holiday cottages, which means the landlord has had to re-open. Unusual circumstances, but welcomed nonetheless. The White Hart is open once again, but remains an unattractive venue as it stands. The Horns re-launched on October 18<sup>th</sup> and initial signs are looking quite good. **Any Other Business** A general discussion was held regarding communication and publicising the sub-branch activities. One suggestion was to get a website up and running, to complement the page we have on Derby's main site. Richard Bright volunteered to look into this. The Twitter account was mentioned as well - there has been a little bit of activity on there. The meeting commenced at 8:15 pm with 7 members in attendance, apologies having been received from Konrad Machej, Chris Rogers, David & Nora Harper, Karen Guest, Mark Little, Anne Kennedy, John & Wendy Truman and Paul Falconer. **Committee:** The Beer Festival Committee was organised thus: Beer Festival Organiser: Trevor Spencer. Deputy: Nigel Heathcote. Minutes Secretary: Nora Harper. Treasurer: Paul Falconer. Staffing: Phil Marshall. Entertainment: Nigel Heathcote. Site Manager: Phil Marshall. Health & Safety: Tom Fleming. beers plus 10 on sale or return were proposed, and due to space restrictions at the venue it is unlikely that any more could be accommodated. We are still awaiting official confirmation from the Strutt Centre, whose meeting was the same night as ours, but the probability is that the arrangements previously discussed with them re the number of rooms required will be acceptable. **Publicity:** Mick suggested a timeline which would include information re the date and venue of the Festival being distributed at Beer Festivals and other CAMRA events, as well as the Belper Green Festival in May. **Sponsorship:** Trevor is dealing with this. Marston's and Pub People's Company will be approached shortly regarding glass sponsorship, as will Pete Hounsel, who has sponsored the t-shirts for the past few years. Individual pubs and breweries will be approached nearer the Festival. Andy said the Black Bulls Head may be able to provide some sponsorship, which the Committee welcomed. **Festival:** Opening times: open all day on Friday and Saturday, with an entry price change at 6pm, and no one in before 6pm will be asked to leave. We have enough wristbands in stock from 2013 to use in 2014. Admission prices will be discussed later as they will be determined by entertainment cost. Beer Prices: this will be determined by ABV, with some slight adjustments for more expensive beers. As in previous years, 2014 will be a token rather than cash Festival. Entertainment: Various types of entertainment were discussed, and the budget for this was set at £2k max. Thursday will be a quiet night, unless artists are willing to perform for beer & expenses, as will Friday afternoon, while good quality entertainment will be sought for Friday and Saturday evening. Saturday afternoon - some entertainment? The layout at the Strutt Centre allows for more varied forms of entertainment, and of course the excellent transport links make it much more accessible. Catering: At Strutt's suggestion Nigel still to here from Howarth's Butchers regarding the Hog Roast. Strutts have expressed a willingness to provide other catering, but we need to consider Fresh Basil, who may partner us at our Festivals, so speak to Strutts re this issue. Layout: Andy expressed concern regarding our proposed use of upstairs rooms as this may be a health and safety problem. Nigel felt that the downstairs rooms suggested as an alternative were too small. The matter will be discussed when we've heard from Strutts. Need to meet Strutts again, and possibly at regular intervals, and this will be arranged in the near future. First Aid/Security: It was decided to use the same people as in

previous Festivals as they had provided excellent cover. **AOB:** As there are areas at both the back and front of the building, Steve suggested that these could be utilized by placing seating there. This was seen as a possibility, weather permitting. **Meeting closed at 930pm.**
