Mickleover Micro Pub Mooted

Mild and Bitter learns that no. 1, Uttoxeter Road, Mickleover, could be the location of a new micro pub if a planning application is approved.

Silk Mill Re-opens

After more than three months' closure, the Silk Mill has finally reopened with a new look and a patio area to the side that's sure to be popular in fair weather. Martin Roper and Denise Sage, who turned around the Exeter's fortunes in startling style, have recruited an experienced chef from the White Hart, Duffield, so food is once again on the menu, and a conservatory has been constructed to accommodate diners. A wide range of real ales is complemented by traditional ciders which will have apple aficionados purring. The John Lombe bar has gone and plasterwork around the fireplaces has been stripped away, revealing brickwork, lending a little old world charm.

Pattenmakers' Unrest

Not for the first time there are rumblings of discontent at the Pattenmakers, Duffield, which is one of Derby CAMRA's Country Pub of the Year finalists. A proposed rent rise by Enterprise Inns threatens to undo much of the good work done by the current custodians, so let's hope that an amicable solution can be found by both parties.

Farewell to the "Livo"

Built in the mid 19thC by the trustees of the Liversage Trust, the Liversage Arms on Nottingham Road, came within a hair's breadth of demolition when the inner ring road was constructed. In the 1970s, when run by Scotsman, Andy Morrow, there was no finer place than this gabled corner house in which to enjoy a pint of Marston's Pedigree. The "Livo" held many a Derby CAMRA branch meeting upstairs and, on occasion, Andy also served Marston's Merrie Monk (no. 5 mild) which was then the nation's strongest mild, positively bursting with flavour. In the 80s it became part of the area known as the "Marston's triangle" in conjunction with the neighbouring Peacock and Exeter. The 21stC has seen various reincarnations fail, therefore it was perhaps inevitable that an application for de-licensing would be made and we understand it will be converted to flats.

Twinned With Toyota

Although many people are aware of our city twinning with Osnabruck and our regular exchanges, our links with Toyota City are less well publicised. In my role as Derby Beer King I have met the Osnabruck Beer King/Gambrinas a number of times and Ferdi has attended The Derby Fest several times. The Japanese twinning is now in its 15th year. I was delighted to be invited by Derby

Tourism to attend a typical English pub lunch at the Exeter with the Toyota City delegation. I donned the royal robes and met the Mayor of Toyota City-Toshihiko Ota and the Chairman of the Council-Hirotaka Siguira. I told the delegates about Derby's title of Real Ale Capital and our two great festivals, and a brief history of the Beer King. I invited them to our next festival and presented them with two 'beer poetry' books. Perhaps a royal visit to the Far East could be on the cards in future! If David Cameron can woo the Chinese, I am ready for Japan!

Obituaries

It's sad to report the passing of two CAMRA members who played significant roles at the Derby beer festivals. **Ray Smith**, 64, did some valuable work on the health and safety side and also put his practical skills to good use. Ray partook of the march on Westminster last December which helped to bring about the rescinding of the loathed Beer Duty Escalator. Ray's funeral was described as a very emotional occasion. **Des Hargreaves**, a member of the cellar team, and known to many for his love of the Furnace, died on 5th December. Derby CAMRA sends its sincere condolences to the bereaved loved ones.

Flowerpot Continues to Bloom

The Flowerpot on King Street didn't make it to the final stages of the Pub of the Year competition but if there was an award for innovation, it would surely have been challenging for honours. An ever changing range of interesting beers (there's always something for the tickers) is underpinned by regulars such as Bishop's Farewell and the on-site Black Iris brewery. The Tuesday evening Gurkha curry nights are increasingly popular and frequent mini-beer festivals are a further attraction. Live bands in the area formerly occupied by Central Tyres continue to be a big draw and M&B understands that the lazy Sunday afternoon acoustic sessions are a big hit with music lovers. So, after 20 years at the forefront of Derby's real ale scene, there's no sign of the Flowerpot resting on its laurels.

Brampton Impy Dark (4.3%) alternates with SIBA champion Brampton Mild (4.9%) and one of the Brunswick's own brews, Railway Porter or the award winning Black Sabbath (6.0%) is always available. The Brunswick's tasty tipples are the work of the pub's professional brewer, James Salmon. And with several good pubs in the vicinity of the railway station, it's well worth the shortish walk from the city centre to sample these fine brews, especially as the Alexandra has a mild and a stout/porter on the bar.
