Join us on the Mild in May and Summer Ale Trail

The Mild in May/Summer Ale Trail will be launched at the **Falstaff on** Silverhill Road, Normanton, on Saturday, 10th May and run until the start of the 37th City Charter Summer Beer Festival. Participants will initially be collecting red "mild" stickers from each pub in return for drinking a half or more of Mild. At the end of May participants will then additionally be able to collect blue "real ale" stickers in return for drinking the same quantity of Real Ale. Stickers, once collected, should be attached to a trail form in Derby Drinker. Additionally forms can be downloaded from the Derby CAMRA website. From 2014 the trail has been increased to 22 pubs as listed below. Not all pubs will stock Mild during the whole of May; in particular the Little Chester Alehouse, Honeycomb, Horse & Groom and Thomas Leaper will have limited availability. Pubs taking part are: Alexandra Hotel, Babington Arms, Bell & Castle, Brewery Tap, Brunswick, Dolphin Inn, Exeter Arms, Falstaff, Five Lamps, Flowerpot, Furnace, Greyhound, Golden Eagle, Honeycomb, Mickleover, Horse & Groom, Little Chester Alehouse, Mr Grundy's, Old Silk Mill, Queens Head, Little Eaton, Royal Oak, Ockbrook, Spa Inn and Thomas Leaper. Members completing the trail will be entitled to up to 4 pints of free beer at the festival, depending on how many stickers they have collected. Additional information will be posted on the Derby CAMRA website. Members are asked to also enter their score on the whatpub.com website.

Perhaps after the local elections on 22ⁿ May we'll have a clearer picture of the building's fate. The entire room rose to applaud retiring National Executive member, Julian Hough, when he was presented with an inscribed 1978 Derby City Charter Beer Festival glass. Julian was the Assembly Rooms' beer festival Hall Manager for very many years. An Extraordinary General Meeting will be held in June to ratify accounts.

Micro Pub for Melbourne

Long standing CAMRA member, David Carpenter, is planning to open a micro pub in the former HSBC bank premises on Melbourne High Street. This proposed new addition to Melbourne's pub scene will be blissfully free of electronic accoutrements and its triple arcaded ground floor frontage is reminiscent of the New Market (Home Ales) which used to stand on Albert Street, Derby.

London Drinker Festival

A small group of Derby CAMRA Special Forces (BLOTS) headed for The London Drinker Beer Festival in the middle of March. The festival prides itself as being 'the longest running beer festival in London in the same venue'-The Camden Centre, conveniently situated near St Pancras station. They had beers from all over the country available, including two from our area, Elsie Mo from Castle Rock and Asteroid from Black Hole. The main reason for our return visit however was to taste the ever-growing number of beers from London micros. There were 44 different beers from 22 London breweries, including old favourites from Sambrooks, Hackney and The Cronx, to strangely named newer ones like 'A Head In a Hat' and 'By The Horns' It was also a treat to taste beers from The Truman's New Brewery...Swift at 4% and London Keeper at 8%. So this is the place to come to sample a huge selection of London beers, perhaps more of our Derby brewers should be networking in the Trade Session, it's a friendly atmosphere with many London brewers in attendance. This was the 30th London Drinker festival and this year is also the 40th anniversary of the organisers- North London CAMRA Branch. Derbyshire's Brewing Revival

If you're visiting one of the beer festivals over the Whitsuntide weekend you might like to raise a glass of Derbyshire ale to the chap who started the county's brewing revival on the same weekend in 1977. I refer, of course, to John Thompson, who launched the superb, fruity JTS XXX (4.5%) after Derbyshire had been bereft of brewing for several years. John, a former market gardener, had converted the ground floor of his substantial Ingleby home into the eponymous pub in 1969, around the time that Derby's Exeter Arms and Belper's Nags Head racked their last brews. Eight years later, entrepreneurial John, set about restoring brewing to England's midmost county, and it was apt that John was invited to pull the first pint at the inaugural Derby City Charter Beer Festival at the King's Hall on 6th April 1978. In 1980, John's sons introduced the Ingleby elixir to Sadlers wine bar, Sadler Gate, Derby, much to the delight of the beer's devotees. Nowadays it's hard to keep up to date with all of the new breweries that are springing up across the county, and the latest estimate is that we're approaching 50. It's a far cry from the 1970s.

Minutes of the Ashbourne Sub-Branch of CAMRA Meeting at the Black Cow, Dalbury Lees, on 25th March 2014

Minutes of the last meeting and matters arising The Minutes had been circulated and were approved. Two slight corrections were noted. No matters were arising. Chairman's Report April is Community Pubs Month. The Chairman reported that he had been updating and expanding the pub information for the WhatPub database. Every pub in our area is photographed and is at least amber status for information. Information required for green status for all pubs in our area would be appreciated as soon as possible. Please refer to site and focus on missing pieces of information - send them to the Chairman and he will update the entries. Two clubs in the town, which are now on the site and can be reported/scored. In the absence of any confirmed approval from region or HQ, the six pubs in limbo on the Staffordshire border have now also been entered onto WhatPub, so that they are now open to anyone who wishes to score them. For the moment, the site flags them as being covered by our sub-branch, but this is not a ratified position and is subject to change /approval. Six pubs are: The George at Alstonefield, The Watts Russell Arms at Hopedale, Ye Olde Royal Oak at Wetton, The Dog & Partridge at Swinscoe, The Rose & Crown at Middle Mayfield, The Duncombe Arms at Ellastone. Details of the next Amber Valley Ramble had been received just prior to the meeting. It was noted that it is due the day after our own proposed trip to Derby and does, in fact, cover virtually the same pubs we intend to visit, so it was agreed that we should look at moving our trip back 24 hours to see if we could join up with Amber Valley. The Chairman would contact the Social Secretary asap to determine if this is feasible. Action: MG Chairman had spoken to Muriel at the Black Horse, Hulland Ward and she said that her last

weekend at the pub will be Friday 4th April - presentation. **Secretary/Treasurer** The secretary was unable to attend due to holiday, but indicated that there are no essential matters to be raised for this meeting. Branch Activity As mentioned, we will possibly combine our proposed Derby trip on 12th April with the Amber Valley Ramble on the 13th. Keith was also unable to attend due to holiday, but asked for interest to be gauged for a trip to the Winding Wheel Beer Festival in Chesterfield on May 15th-17th. Phil Lee expressed his interest and there may well be others, but due to the low attendance tonight, we will have to get further confirmations via e-mails etc in the next couple of weeks. **Pub Reports** The Dog & Partridge, Thorpe – Phil Lee reported that internal decoration is still taking place and he had not yet heard of an official opening date, although it was originally targeted at Easter. It is still understood that the pub will revert to an earlier name of the Dog & Duck, to avoid confusion with the other Dog & Partridge at Swinscoe. The Yew Tree, Ednaston - they have redecorated throughout, changed one of the bar counters, introduced a pizza oven, now have catering staff and have installed a barrel of Pedigree behind the bar, alongside two beers served by handpump. The new owner reported great renewed interest from the village population. Beer Festival The chairman expressed concern that time was running short and nothing yet was in place for the projected date in August. He had spoken to some parties at the Green Man during Shrovetide, but three weeks have lapsed since then and we have not been able to make any firm plans. There are also some concerns about how the open access to the courtyard may present some issues of control. Previous concerns had already been raised about the timing over the August Bank Holiday due to other local pub festivals close to the town. Dave Leigh reported that the alterations to the Town Hall had apparently resulted in an increase in capacity. It was agreed that we should explore moving the festival dates back to the end of September/October - noting that Amber Valley's Festival is the last weekend of September - and to also examine the chances of returning to the Town Hall as it is the longer-term preferred option.
