The pub was renowned as a "late shout" long before 24 hour licensing. Drinking "after hours" induced an enjoyable sense of guilt, no more so than when we joined Sheffield CAMRA on a memorable pub crawl of the railway station pubs. Finishing at the Alexandra for a late drink, some of our number didn't leave until 230am. Today, the pub is in the capable hands of Ralf and Anna Dyson-Edge, serving excellent Castle Rock beers and guests. And those with a penchant for bottled beers may choose from at least 50 varieties. So why not join us to mark this significant milestone in our history.....but don't expect to be staying until 230am!

EGM: The 2013 winter festival and 2013 branch accounts were to have been the subject of an **Extraordinary General Meeting** but this was not possible. Julian Tubbs explained that he had not been able to get Kevin Hepworth to audit the accounts yet, though Kevin had started them. John Arguile had similarly not been in possession of the accounts for long enough to process them. It was deigned that an EGM be held at the Wednesday, 13th August branch meeting at the Brunswick. DD advertising revenue was still problematic. New website is up and running to handle the arrears. Feedback sought. John Arguile, as branch auditor, had produced up to date lists showing £14,000 arrears. He proposed advanced invoicing ahead of adverts in future as per last year. He also expressed concerns about branch accounts having summer festival items in them as this might involve revisions of the said accounts.

Apologies for absence Tim and Les Williams, Konrad Machej, Charlie Pratt, Gillian Hough, Paul Gibson. **Minutes of last meeting** Printed for meeting and circulated. Accepted as a true record. **Matters arising** None. **Officers’ reports:** **Chair** Gareth asked the branch to think about the sad loss of branch stalwart, Julian Hough, who sadly passed away last week. A celebration of his life was to take place at the Royal Oak at Ockbrook after the funeral. He will be missed by us in the branch and nationally. Condolences were extended to Gillian, his widow. Members reminisced and related stories about Julian. There were many, many happy memories of a fine man, and he will be truly missed. May he rest in peace. Ale trail is still

Minutes of the Ashbourne Sub-Branch of CAMRA Annual General Meeting, held at The Cock Inn, Clifton, on 27th May 2014

East Midlands Regional Director: Carl Brett. **Apologies** Michelle Leigh, Kim Dorrington, Stephen Oliver. **Minutes of 2013 Meeting** These Minutes had been circulated and were approved. **Matter Arising** None. **Chairman's Report** Mark Grist gave a full report of the year's activity and confirmed that he was willing to continue to serve as Chairman if this was the wish of members. A copy of the report is attached. **Secretary's Report** The Secretary reported that current records showed the Branch to have 60 members, an increase of 17 during the year. There had been one lapsed membership. Derby Branch records showed 68 members to be covered by the Ashbourne sub-Branch. Of those registered 16 members had not provided email addresses and received Branch updates by post. The base for the current Ashbourne membership remained the list of members issued when the sub-Branch was formed in 2012, plus updates issued by CAMRA between May 2013-April 2014 as no new full membership list had been provided in May 2013 as requested. It was agreed that the membership list should be rationalised. Konrad Machej was asked to help the

Secretary obtain a full membership list from CAMRA HQ. **Action:** **Secretary/Konrad Machej Treasurer's Report** In 2013-14 the Sub-Branch had access to funds of £221.27 raised from sub-Branch activity. This fund was used for secretarial expenses including stamps, stationery and IT consumables and to pay a Branch affiliation fee as a Community Group to Ashbourne Community Transport which was used for Branch pub survey trips. At 30 April 2014 funds of £119.57 were held. An Income and Expenditure report is attached to these Minutes. It was confirmed that the sub-Branch was entitled to claim financial support for members' correspondence and for transport for pub survey trips. The Treasurer would approach the Derby Branch Treasurer. **Action:** **Treasurer Appointment of Sub-Branch Officers** The following were nominated and agreed unanimously: Chairman M. Grist; Secretary/Treasurer*+ Pat Laughlin; Membership Secretary M. Grist+; Social Secretary Keith Palmer*+ For 2014/15 it was agreed that these posts should continue to be held jointly. Derby members asked that other Sub-Branch members should consider taking on additional roles which could also support the Festival arrangements. A full list of roles can be found on the CAMRA website. **Resolutions** None received. **Any Other Business; Beer Festival Report** The 2014 Festival dates were confirmed as 11-13 October at the Ashbourne Town Hall. It was known that the Nottingham festival would be taking place on the same weekend. The following Festival Officers were approved: Festival Chairman M. Grist; Festival Treasurer Pat Laughlin; Festival Organiser Dave Leigh; Festival Music & Entertainment Kim Dorrington; Festival Health & Safety David Coackley; Festival Marketing and Sponsorship Michelle Leigh/Hannah Barton. The roles of Staffing Co-ordinator and Publicity Officer were still to be filled and volunteers were required to support the event. Tim Challans, Gareth & Lizzie Butterfield and Kevin Woolley had already offered assistance. Festival planning meetings would now be held fortnightly on Tuesday evenings at the Smiths Tavern. The first meeting was scheduled for Tuesday 10 June 2014. Carl Brett reminded the meeting that a festival budget needed to be approved by CAMRA at least four months in advance of the event in order to secure HQ and Derby Branch support. It was confirmed that the draft budget would be available by 1 June 2014. **Action:** **D. Leigh/M. Grist. Sub-Branch Coverage** The allocation of pubs with DE postcodes located in Staffordshire remained the subject of negotiation between the East and West Midlands branches. Ashbourne members were keen to see six pubs which fell under this category allocated formally to the Sub-Branch as currently these pubs received no direct support from CAMRA members. It

was noted that the Sub-Branch Chairman had ensured that these pubs were recorded on What Pub. It was suggested and agreed that members would take responsibility for maintaining regular contact with pubs in their own neighbourhood and also to assist with the distribution of Derby Drinker. KP agreed to take responsibility for Ednaston, Brailsford, Shirley & Hollington and KW for Kniveton and Hognaston. A list of pubs is attached for members to identify which ones they would cover. **Action:** **All. Ashbourne CAMRA AGM Chairman's Report

We have now completed more than two full years as a sub-branch and some changes have occurred in recent months to increase our profile both locally and within the regional and national set-up of CAMRA. Principally, after some protracted discussions with both our parent branch and with the relevant regional directors, we have increased our area of coverage for two main reasons. The first is to offer a better localised focal point for those CAMRA members who have previously not felt able to affiliate themselves to the main branch area and hopefully encourage them to join in with our activities and campaigns. The second is to offer a better coverage for reviewing pubs in the area that may possibly have suffered from a lack of reviews due to being distanced from the main branch's activity. I have spent some considerable time entering and updating information on WhatPub, so that this now reflects the true position. This does also include the two clubs in our town, so this now means our coverage has increased from 30 pubs to a total of 48 pubs & clubs, which does include two or three that we know of that are currently closed, but which will hopefully be open again in the near future. Some other minor adjustments may mean our total goes just beyond 50. This is quite a large number for a small group of us to cover on a regular basis, but I would like to emphasise the importance of keeping information up to date by regular visits to all these establishments. This is clearly more readily achievable for those pubs we all visit regularly, but I would ask all members to take a look at the current listing and perhaps each select a small group of just three or four pubs that they could then target for at least one visit each every six months or so, to keep abreast of any changes in beer quality, opening hours etc. As a group, we should try to set out a few campaigning goals that we wish to achieve in the next twelve months. I am happy to suggest that 100% listings on Whatpub for all pubs in our area should be the main target for us. A second suggestion from myself would be to aim to produce a very simple newsletter for the sub-branch, something of just a couple of

sides of paper to begin with, that we can distribute out to our pubs alongside the Derby Drinker. Any suggestions for a title and layout would be most welcome tonight. I am happy to take suggestions for a third campaigning goal which we can decide on by the next meeting. Now that we have settled on dates for our next beer festival, it will be important for as many people as possible to offer their services both in the lead-up to the event and during the event itself, so I would like to ask you all to help us to put on as good an event as we managed last time and to please talk to myself and Dave about what can be achieved. We will be setting up regular beer festival meetings and would appeal for the best possible attendances for those as well as the monthly meetings. Finally, I am happy to take on the role again for the next 12 months if re-elected and hope to see the group expand some more in the coming year, both in terms of overall numbers and perhaps also with some volunteers looking at some of the wider specific roles that the sub-branch could operate.

Fisherman's Rest, Broadholme, Threatened

Dave Mountford, the GMB union Secretary for the Matlock area, has written to the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills regarding the plight of the Marston's pub just north of Belper. The tenant, and his parents, have invested significant sums attempting to turn around the fortunes of the pub but it is alleged that their plans have been jeopardised by alterations to their business budget, an unrealistic rent, and reports of the previous tenant's serious breaches of hygiene regulations which led to damaging publicity. In short, the current tenant is now believed to have cash flow problems and although the tenancy doesn't expire until 2016 we understand that the pub has been marketed for sale.
