Locally, our numbers are down, with 15,055 in the East Midlands, and Derby Branch membership fell 63 to 2,061 at the end of May.

**Minutes of the Last Meeting:**

Approved and no matters arising.

**Treasurers Report:**

We worked out a remittance value to send to HQ which has been delayed as we didn't get the money from the venue. We have drawn up a budget for different areas of CAMRA and we will be having a beer festival this year. We sold 120 copies of the GBG. The Smithfield had 2 boxes worth of the guides which we claimed and redistributed. Gillian said some regions are not able to sell anything near the amount we sell. We made £260 from the sale of the books.

**Social Events & Beer Festivals:**

The calendar has been updated, there is a sausage and cider festival at the Dead Poets from 18<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> June. Afternoon social, midday Golden Eagle on the 4<sup>th</sup> July. Re ABC, we have one leader per route but looking to have an additional per route if members can let James know. Melbourne social trip on 31<sup>st</sup> July. A trip on the first day (Tuesday) of the Great British Beer Festival, if you can contact James if interested. The Standing Order have a cider festival and will accept the 50p vouchers. CAMRA has strict rules about what is real Cider and we don't have a list of what cider is being sold and don't know if they will adhere to our standards. We have been invited to a special event the day before on 26<sup>th</sup> June. The event for everyone else runs from the 27<sup>th</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> July. Summer of Beer - We are looking at a range of tours that start from the centre of Derby and work outwards. We want to ensure that there are incentives for potential members to join CAMRA. The Smithfield is classed as a joint festival with Derby CAMRA but we do not supply staff for the festival. The Smithfield are very supportive and we have a marquee to promote membership. Gillian supported the idea of the pub using 50p vouchers. Tim thinks that it's important the members know what we are doing and what benefits they have by joining and we should ensure the public has a good visibility of CAMRA. Steve said there is a beer festival in Heanor on the 26<sup>th</sup> July across multiple venues. Russell: The festival budget has been approved. We had great support for being contactless but will need to operate some level of cash payments. The next festival meeting will be 25<sup>th</sup> June, Smithfield at 8.00pm. We are looking to purchase a small cooler to support local beer and music festivals, this has been budgeted for.

**Regional**

The Regional Director got the vote of 14 out of 24 when a minimum requirement is 12.

There is very little information coming through, the RD has been re-elected and wants to address the communication issues between branches and the region. Re the regional review, South Derbyshire will move within the Derby branch but HQ has contradicted this and further information is required.

**Pub & Brewery News:**

The Abbey is due to reopen on the 20<sup>th</sup> June. Red Lion at Kniveton won South Derbyshire Cider POTY. Tasting panels are now being pushed to the forefront of marketing.

**National News:**

Handpump Hijack, the campaign is gaining momentum and being pushed by MP Baggy Shanker. We want people to report any beers that you notice that are selling Fresh Beer. The ones to look out for are Hobgoblin and Wainwright's. Take a picture of the handpump clip and send it through to the committee. **When we're on the ABC, please let us know if these beers are identified and we can complete the assessment.** We are awaiting more information from the WhatPub replacement. There is a link on the national website where you can complete a survey form. Kevin said CAMRA is attempting to ensure Real Ale becomes a protected product, similar to Stilton and Champagne.

**Membership & Recruitment:**

At the conference it was announced that there will be an increase of £3.50 to the membership of CAMRA. This will happen from the start of July, and there will be a new marketing campaign to ensure members retain membership. **Membership report** – please see page 2. Ideas are welcome for recruitment & engagement.

**Communications:**

We have discussed using different social media platforms and this needs to be encouraged. The idea would be to have 2 or 3 people

more to help with posting information. If wanting more content on the website please send through an editable document.

Gareth, Kevin, and Alan discussed how we would proceed with Derby Drinker, and compared it to other magazines. Part of the publicity budget will be used to increase the Derby Drinker. The number of releases to be 5 rather than 4. During the busy periods of beer festivals we will have magazines bi-monthly and then a gap of 4 months in the winter months when it's quieter. We looked at the prices and we are the second highest in terms of costs, we are looking to reduce the prices and a further discount if they pay for 5 editions. The next issue will be August/September, we will also have a series of marketing cards with prices printed for the distributors. The issue date will be the first week of August.

Russell is supporting the plans for Derby Drinker and he thinks that's important we try these new things
